Bils, the director of UO Students for Equity in Insurance, has contended since last spring that Lone Star Insurance paid claims late, reimbursed policy holders far below the correct amount, had unreasonable deductibles, made unreasonable claim denials and refused to pay a 1.5 percent per month interest rate unless specifically requested by the policy holder, he said.

The ASUO is as much at fault as Lone Star in the matter by choosing not to publicly acknowledge the possibility of

his allegations, Bils said. And Rasmussen is in definite conflict of interest because he can't represent students against Lone Star and also represent the ASUO in insurance matters, he said.

Nelson said he will not resign. He said the ASUO Insurance Committee has been working since summer to clear up any difficulties connected with Lone Star, which is no longer the ASUO student insurance carrier. The ASUO switched from Lone Star to the Keystone Insurance Co. this

summer.

"We have a list of approximately 50 names of students who may be eligible for some money because of the 1.5 percent interest clause. We'll be getting letters out to those people sometime soon," Nelson said. "There are two cases of Lone Star not paying the agreed 80 percent on claims submitted left to be worked out."

Rasmussen also refused to resign.

"I'm under contractual obligation to the ASUO," Rasmussen said. "I don't have a job that I can resign from. If I quit, I'd be breaching my contract, and I have no intention of either breaching my contract or resigning my position because Willy Bils is playing student politics and wants to involve me in it."

Rasmussen assumed responsibility for insurance-related complaints in May 1986, after Nelson shifted the responsibility from the Office of Student Advocacy to the Office of Legal Services, and continued until Jan. 23 when an independent attorney took over.

Rasmussen, who said he handled fewer than 10 complaints, was removed to avoid any impression of impropriety, Nelson said.

Nelson, who was in Salem at the time of the press conference, said he had received no written complaint to him or his office from Bils until Jan. 23. He said he doesn't consider an advertisement, placed in the Oct. 8 Oregon Daily Emerald by UO Students for Equity in Insurance, that outlined allegations of insurance mismanagement as a complaint directed at him or the ASUO.

"This is a young program, and through all this I'm not maintaining the position of 'hear no evil, see no evil' and 'cover up' with ASUO," Nelson said. "Obviously if we'd been doing this for 15 years, we probably could have caught these problems quicker. But if you're talking mismanagement, then no, we haven't mismanaged the program."

Bils maintains that the program is mismanaged, and if Nelson doesn't resign, he will begin impeachment proceedings against him.

"This is a battle of the wills, my will against Nelson's," Bils said. "And his will is going to break."
