physical advantage of the students and the deeming has to be done by the State Board of Higher Education or by the people who delegate authority through the president of the university."

He added there has to be some physical connection between the expenditure of those funds and the advancement of at least some significant kind of cultural or physical enterprise.

"Not that everyone will agree that they like the cause for which the funds are being spent, but at least a significant group of students is being impacted in a positive way in its educational experience," he said.

Frohnmayr concluded on the issue of funding politically active groups that "there is probably a fair amount of latitude."

He said the State Board of Higher Education or university president has to make the final determination if expenditures actually advance the interests of a significant portion of the student body.

Frohnmayr then opened the floor to student questions.
