available faculty positions, said Associate Law Professor Charles O'Kelley. O'Kelley chairs the law school faculty selection committee. In addition, the law school has brought two minority faculty candidates from a total of six to campus.

Though reluctant to discuss the status of minority faculty at the law school, O'Kelley said, "We're committed to greater

diversity and we are doing the best we can."

Burnalle Powell, a black law professor visiting from the University of North Carolina, is currently at the University, he said.

Acting as interim assistant law school dean is Academic Support Director Charles Finke. Nagae's resignation came as a surprise, Finke said.

The lack of minority faculty representation is a disadvantage to the University, Finke said. "Obviously it is a high priority. It's something the faculty appointment committee has been trying to solve," he said.

A full search is being conducted for a replacement for Nagae's position, headed by current Law School Dean Maurice Holland, said the dean's administrative assistant Sallie Kirkpatrick.

While acting as assistant dean and assistant professor of law, Nagae was often identified as a faculty member with an active commitment to increasing the number of minority students at the University Law School.

"She (Nagae) has been phenomenal in bringing minority students to the law school," and her presence will be missed, said Richard Monette, co-director of the Minority Law Student Association.

"Peggi was a mentor to the minority student.... There is hardly anyone more committed, energetic and dynamic than Peggi," Monette said.
