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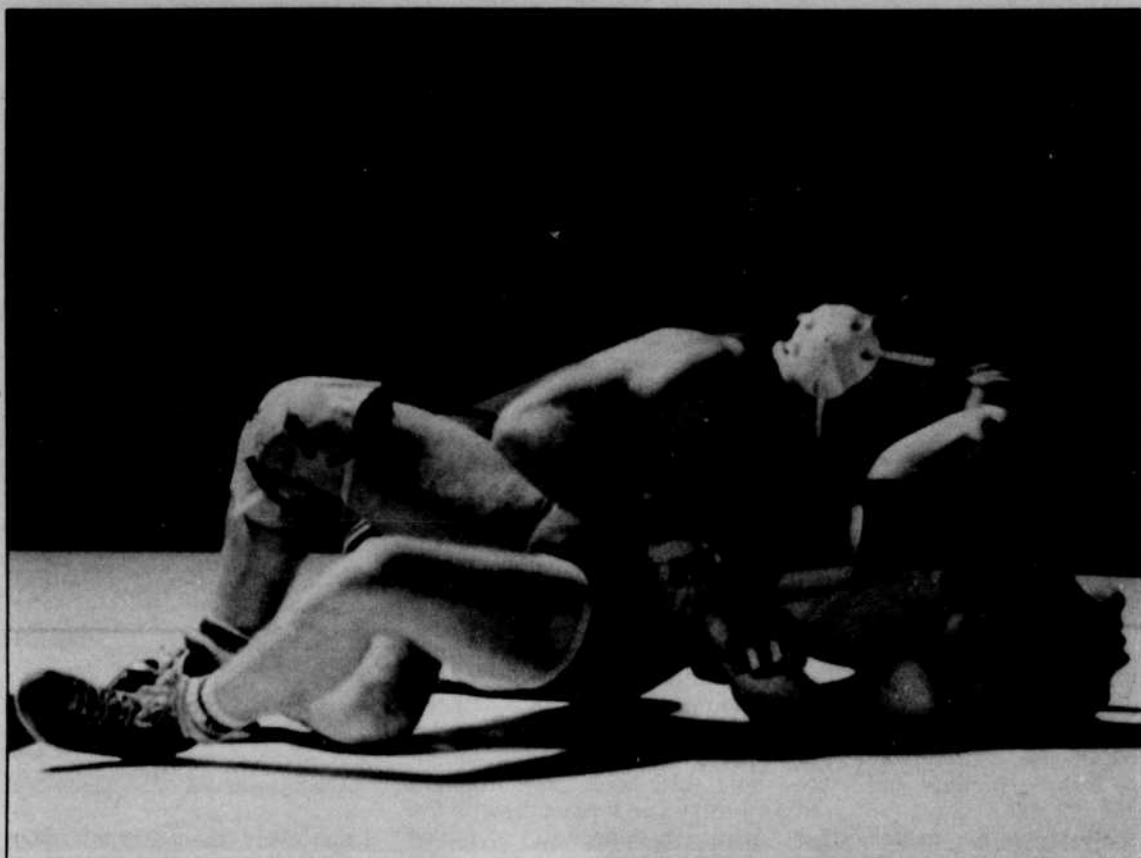

Wrestlers win home finale

The Oregon wrestling team bounced back after suffering three dual-meet losses over the weekend to upend Pacific University, 22-13, Tuesday night in McArthur Court.

"We didn't wrestle as well as we had the last three matches — even though we lost them," said Oregon head coach Ron Finley. "We were a little flat, but we finally got another win, and we really needed a win bad — especially at home."

The victory improved the Ducks' overall record to 8-12 with only one dual meet remaining before the Pacific-10 Conference championships March 7-8 in Corvallis.

Finley knew before the match that the Ducks wouldn't have an easy time with the visiting Boxers, noting that Pacific has "good, sound wrestlers."

"I knew it would be close from the start," Finley said. "I thought it might come down to the heavyweight match — and it

virtually did."

Pacific got on the scoreboard first with Calvin Matutino's hard-fought 9-6 decision over Oregon's Roberto Pelayo in the opening 118-pound bout.

"Matutino is an excellent wrestler," acknowledged Finley. "Roberto didn't wrestle that bad, but Matutino was just tough."

James Hawthorne, the Ducks' 126-pounder, put Oregon out in front, 4-3, with a 15-4 major decision over the Boxers' Steve Thorpe.

"James wrestled as good as anybody tonight," Finley said. "He is really coming into his own and exploding into his moves."

Oregon's Shon Lewis gave the Ducks some breathing room with a 13-6 win over Chuck Calhoun in the 134-pound confrontation. Lewis' victory, improving his record to 24-3-1 on the season, gave the Ducks a 7-3 lead.

But Pacific quickly responded with two straight wins to

go up 10-7.

Chuck Ahsmuhs beat Oregon's Tom Kastrava, 7-2, at 124 pounds and Jed Stone defeated the Ducks' Richey Ford, 8-1, at 150 pounds.

The Ducks came back with two wins of their own to regain the lead, 13-10.

Oregon's 158-pounder Vince Hochanadel knotted the team score at 10, recording a 7-3 decision over Lance Hobson.

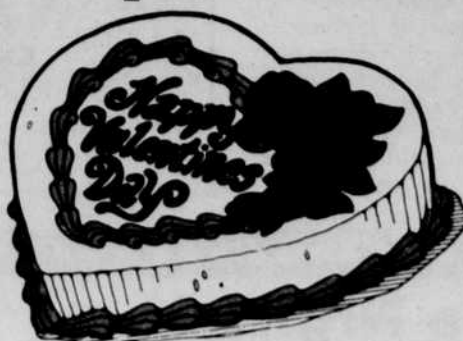
Brian Jackson came through with a big victory for the Ducks in the following match (167 pounds), edging Lawrence Owen 6-3. The win was Jackson's first since being out of the lineup for almost a month with illness and injury.

"He showed some signs of fatigue, but it was a big win for him and certainly an important one for the team," Finley said of the win that put the Ducks up 13-10.

The Boxers did not bow down, however, as they evened

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
