Asian Council plans celebration

A Chinese lion dance symbolizing good luck, prosperity and the absence of evil spirits will open the second annual Asian Celebration on Sunday at the Lane County Fairgrounds.

"As Asians we would like to share our culture with everyone in the Eugene/Springfield community," said Vern Ho, Asian Celebration facilitator.

The idea for the celebration started in 1985 when a dinner and Asian entertainment was held at the Eugene Hilton for a visiting Chinese business man. After the dinner, several people decided to organize a council in order to coordinate a similar production for the entire community.

The Asian Council of Eugene/Springfield, consisting of members of the Japanese, Chinese, Philippine, Indonesian, Thai, Vietnamese and Pacific Islander communities, has been organizing the celebration for the past three months.

The purpose of the celebration is to stress cultural awareness instead of just concentration on the political and racial aspects of the Asian community, Ho said.

"With an increase in the Asian population to this area, many Asians felt the need to meet others, while at the same time, sponsor activities to heighten the community's awareness of the diverse Asian communities residing in this area," Ho said.

Each of the 200 people who participate in the celebration do so on a volunteer basis. The money raised from last year's celebration was used to produce an Asian business directory. Money from this year's celebration will be put toward presenting more Asian cultural events such as cooking classes, and art and dance presentations.

Between 60 to 75 percent of the 1,542 foreign students at the University are from Asian countries, and many of these students will participate in the celebration.

"We have a program at the University in which some foreign students are receiving scholarship money in return for sharing their culture," said Peter Briggs, International Services assistant director.

Some of the Asian students who are in this program will be working at the celebration, either performing or cooking.

"We often get requests from members of the community asking how they could invite foreign students to their schools, which is how Vern (Ho) contacted us," Briggs said.

Steve Tjokro, a University student from Indonesia, said he enjoys going to the various cultural activities presented in Eugene throughout the year and will be going to the celebration to see the Indonesian dancers.

Tjokro, who has been at the University for two years, is interested in seeing how different countries are represented in the United States.

"As an Asian student, I like to know how my country as well as other Asian countries will be presented at the celebration," he said.
