## Week to recognize campus honoraries

The University's 27 honor societies will be the focus of Honors Week, today through Friday.

Coordinated by the Mortar Board, the week will coincide with national Mortar Board Week. Mortar Board is a national academic and service honorary for university seniors.

Honor societies at the University are a mixture of academic, professional and service honoraries. Last year more than

900 students and faculty belonged to honoraries at the University.

Honor societies are both important and misunderstood, said Sharon Bosserman, president of the University Mortar Board.

"Honor societies are important because they give people much-deserved recognition," she said. "However, I also think that there's a common misconception in that the general public thinks honor societies are for smart, intellectual, bookworm-type people, when actually members tend to be quite active people who provide service and volunteer their time in the community."

To break away from the misconceptions surrounding honor societies, Eugene 4-J Schools Superintendent Margaret Nichols, an advocate of peace education, was invited to deliver the keynote speech.

Nichols will speak at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday in the EMU Fir Room.

Other Honors Week events include the presentation of awards to more than 80 juniors who have outstanding academic achievement at 7 p.m. tonight in Gerlinger Hall.
