Under the plan, the state rather than athletic departments would fund athletic scholarships, allowing athletic departments to spend the money on things such as program improvements.

The group has until Tuesday to introduce legislation, Di Torrice said. Should SOS miss the deadline, it will seek a legislative interim task force to study the issue in depth, putting the issue before the 1989 Legislature.

"We believe that quality higher education programs will be maintained in Oregon as we address the financial needs of our talented athletes," Di Torrice said. "We can achieve this support by supporting the academic winners who par-

ticipate in the various UO athletic programs."

taining their patience. "There's a lot of hot things happening in the Legislature right now," Di Torrice said. "We're taking things one step at a time and not pushing."

Organizing and planning SOS, which got off the ground

twice a month, hoping to gain support for the movement.

"We're not just a booster club," Di Torrice noted, "we're a little deeper than that."

"We're a grass-roots citizens' organization trying to take on a massive effort," Havercroft added.

One of the people they have managed to impress is State System Chancellor William Davis. "With the chancellor behind us, it makes things a lot easier," Di Torrice said.

"Any time anyone can get us some kind of state funding, as long as it doesn't take away from higher education, I'm all for it," said Athletic Director Bill Byrne.

SOS has 25 members and has received endorsements and financial support from the Oregon Club, Daisy Ducks and the Lane County UO Alumni Chapter. The group is currently working to generate additional support for its public education efforts from the Eugene Area Chamber of Commerce and the Eugene/Springfield Visitors & Convention Bureau.

While the fruits of their labor may not come for some time, the task of research and organization is keeping the group members plenty busy. "We've been putting in a sizable amount of work," Di Torrice said.

"We didn't enter this for the short term," he added. "We're in it for the long haul."
