

University ski team scores big with few dollars

For the last 10 weeks, a group of 35 University students has been devoting much of their time to a University endeavor that gets very little acclaim. Thursday, three divisions of the four-division University ski team will travel to McCall, Idaho for a regional ski championship.

There, the club sport team will try to secure individual or team spots at the national competition, to take place at Mount Crested Butte in Colorado, in early March.

The team consists of 21 competing members; seven men and seven women who ski the alpine event and four men and three women nordic skiers. Of the 14 alpine skiers, two men and two women are alternate racers.

The team is a member of the National Collegiate Skiing Association's Southern division which, of the eight teams, also includes Oregon State University, Portland State, Southern Oregon State

College and Lewis and Clark.

The top three teams in the each division are invited to the regionals. The men's and women's alpine and the women's nordic teams finished in the upper bracket of their division and have been invited to the regionals. The women's alpine finished first overall and the men's alpine was tied for first in the point standings.

According to Barb Rogers, ski team racer, administrator and sometimes coach, the team operates on a tight budget. "Our budget is around \$8,000 — \$4,000 comes from the club sports department and we raise the other from different fundraisers throughout the year."

Much of the necessary expenditures are picked up by the skiers themselves, although club sports supplies transportation in state vans to and from the ski sites and supplies whatever lodging it can. Skiers must pay for their own lift tickets when practicing, which reduces the number of people who try out for the

team, according to the club's members.

Rogers says the southern division is the most relaxed division, with team members from opposing teams cheering

for each other. No one seems to let the competition interfere with the fun.
