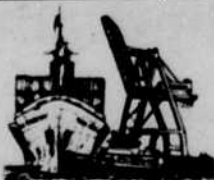

Bruins roll over Ducks with shooting accuracy

It was a brutal men's basket-
ball game Sunday afternoon in
McArthur Court.

The UCLA Bruins stunned
the Ducks 102-71 before a pack-
ed house of 10,003.

After the game, Oregon coach
Don Monson just shook his
head and said: "There's not too
much to say. It's been a long
time since I've been beaten like

that... It was just a good old
country whipping."

But credit is due to UCLA.
The Bruins played a near
flawless game, shooting the
lights out of "the Pit."

UCLA shot 73 percent from
the field for the first 30 minutes
of the game and probably would
have continued the sizzling
pace if Bruin coach Walt Hazard
hadn't freely gone to the bench
for substitutions. As it was,
though, the Bruins shot almost
63 percent from the field for the
game on 39 of 62.

The ultimate statistic was
UCLA's accuracy from three-
point range — 11 of 15 for the
game, including seven of nine
in the first half.

Monson said he couldn't
remember another team
shooting that well against one
of his teams, but he gave no ex-
cuses: "I always feel if they
shoot that well then we weren't
out on them enough."

But it's doubtful that
anything could have stopped
UCLA. All 12 Bruins scored, in-
cluding five who reached dou-
ble figures.

Forward Reggie Miller led the
UCLA attack with 20 points,
while Oregon native Dave Im-
mel poured in 17 despite the
crowd booing him every time he
touched the ball. Immel was
seven of nine from the field, in-
cluding a perfect three of three
from three-point range.

"It's just one of those games
you put behind you and try to
go from there," Monson said.

The Ducks travel to
Washington this weekend to
complete their Pac-10 regular
season against the Huskies
Thursday and the Cougars
Saturday.
