Ducks squeak by Cougars, extend winning streak to 10

"I hope it was a great scare," Oregon women's basketball coach Elwin Heiny said after his team escaped with a 74-70 Pacific 10 Conference victory over Washington State University Saturday night in McArthur Court.

"Sometimes losses are good, but better yet, a near loss that you win to prove a point — that on any given day anyone can beat you," Heiny said.

The win pulled the Ducks, 13-3 in league play, into a tie for the Pac-10 conference lead with USC and Washington. It also marked Oregon's 13th victory at home — a school record — the 12th in a row in Mac Court and their 10th consecutive win overall, their longest winning streak in six years.

The game seesawed back and forth for more than 10 minutes with four lead changes occurring before the Ducks began to pull away from the Cougars, who reside in the Pac-10 cellar with a 2-14 record.

Oregon turned an narrow 18-17 lead at the 9:16 mark into a 40-21 advantage with 2:43 left

in the first half. During this span, senior guard Lauri Landerholm, playing possibly her last game at Mac Court, scored 12 points to spark the Ducks.

WSU managed to trim the lead slightly, but Oregon still took a comfortable 42-27 lead into the locker room at halftime. Maybe a little too relaxed after a 101-55 thumping of the Cougars earlier this season and grabbing the early momentum Saturday, the Ducks came out to open the second half very flat.

WSU took advantage of Oregon's lack of intensity and outscored the Ducks 14-4 in the first 5:24, forcing Coach Heiny to call a timeout and proceed to yank his starters and empty the bench.

"We were totally flat," Heiny admitted. "We had no real effort on defense, and our offensive execution wasn't there."

Landerholm, one of the starters who was taken out of the game, noted that the Ducks

need to be able to pick up where they left off in the first half.

"We need to work on coming back and building on the lead, rather than sitting back and trying to hold on to it."

Heiny benched his starting crew for almost six-and-a-half minutes.

"I didn't put them back in quickly mostly because of my stubbornness," he said. "But (the replacements) maintained composure and kept the game Saturday, as it was."

When the starters re-entered the game, they were still sluggish, to Heiny's dissatisfaction.

WSU tied the score at 53 before forward Gabi Neumann finally hit a field goal after a 10:09 Oregon drought — the Ducks hadn't made a field goal since Neumann's layup at the 17:33 mark.

The Cougars came right back to capture their first lead of the second half, 57-55, on Jonni

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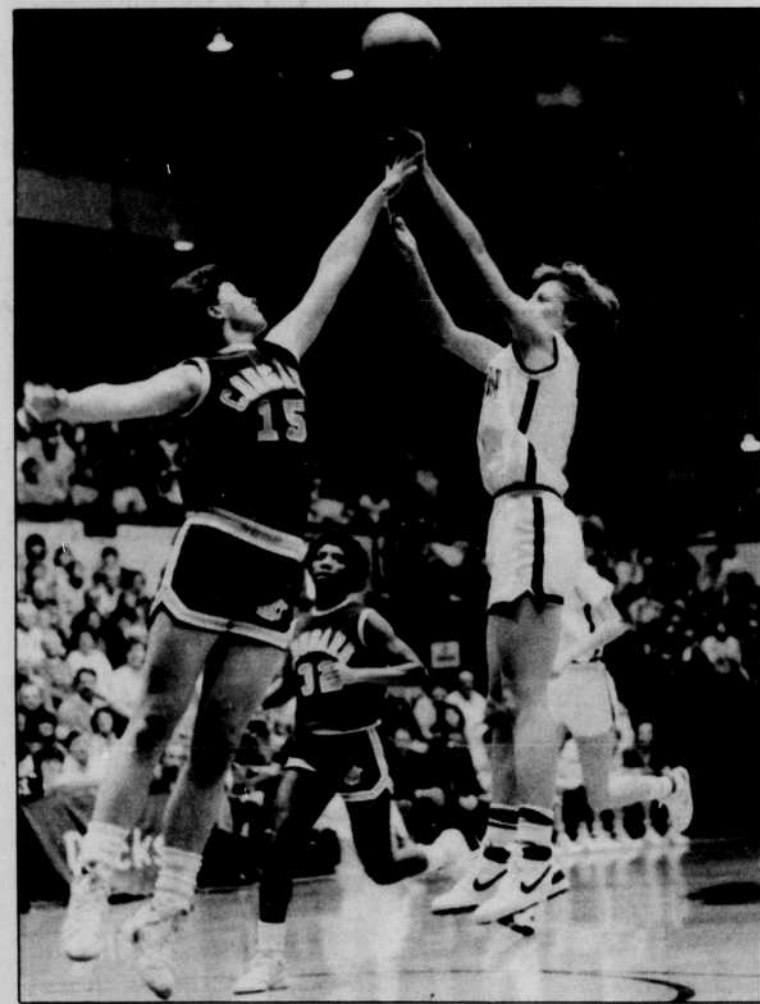
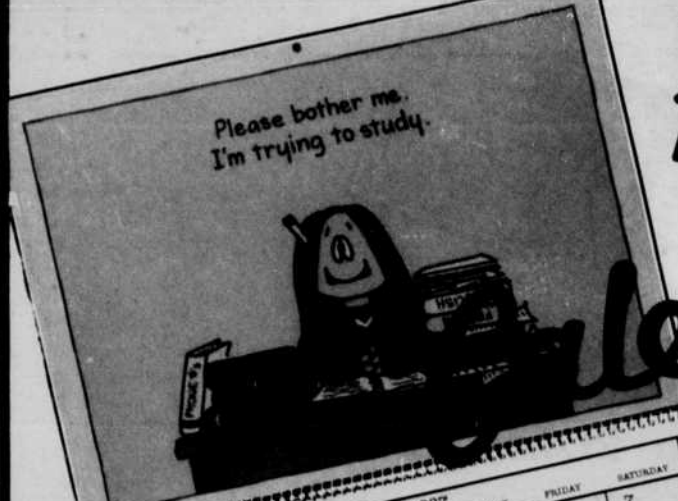
