Softball team welcomes depth, tries luck in Vegas for opener

The Oregon softball team will look to improve on last year's 20-30 record and fifth-place finish in the now defunct Nor-Pac Conference as they open the 1987 season on Thursday against San Diego State University in Las Vegas, Nevada.

The Ducks have 11 new faces on the team this year, including three junior college transfers and eight freshmen.

Two newcomers, outfielder Kira Lewis and catcher Cheryl Coryell, played for state high school champion Churchill last year.

Despite the large player turnover, Oregon coach Teresa Wilson is optimistic about the coming year.

"We've got a well-rounded team," she said. "We have a lot of depth, and that's something we didn't have last year."

"And the kids are hungry to get out there and start playing," she added.

Wilson said there's also a sense of team unity this year, a quality she said was lacking last season.

"The pitchers especially have been real confident with the infielders and outfielders we have playing behind them," she said.

"That's important, because the pitchers will determine how we do this year," she said, adding that pitching is 90 percent of the game.

The Ducks will carry three pitchers this season, including last year's starters, senior Sony Schroeder and junior Susan Voeller. Schroeder and Voeller will see most of the action this season, Wilson said.

Schroeder compiled a 7-15 record overall last year with 51 strikeouts and a 2.78 ERA. She will co-captain the team along with catcher Stacye Gustafson, a junior college transfer from Inglewood, California.

Voeller finished the season with a 6-13 record (1-3 in Nor-Pac games), striking out 74 batters in the 163 innings she pitched.

In addition to being a starting pitcher, Voeller was the Ducks' leading hitter last year with a .276 average (all games).

Wilson says the added depth will give the team a strong lineup, both offensively and defensively.

"Depth is definitely one of our strengths. We have more speed in the lineup, and we have good hitters — one through nine," she said, even though last year's second- and third-leading hitters, Susan Uhrich and Christi Long, are no longer with the team.

Defensively, Oregon has one starting outfielder returning from last year and two starters from the infield also coming back.

The Ducks will play San Diego State in Las Vegas on March 5, and will remain there for the Lady Rebel Softball Tournament, March 6-7.

Tournament teams will include UCLA, University of Utah, San Diego State, Colorado State University, Creighton University, University of Nevada-Reno, and University of Nevada-Las Vegas.

"Basically, the tournament will just give me an opportunity to experiment with different lineups and combinations of players to see who plays well in certain situations," Wilson said.

Oregon will compete for the first time in the Pacific 10 Conference this year, along with Arizona State University, University of Arizona, University of California at Berkeley, UCLA and Oregon State University.
