

Higher Education Day draws legislators, alumni, officials

Monday was "Higher Education Day" at the Oregon Legislative Assembly in Salem.

Alumni, legislators, higher education officials and Gov. Neil Goldschmidt met throughout the day to discuss the role higher education should play in the "Oregon Comeback" plan.

The State System of Higher Education with its eight public 4-year colleges and universities is the topic of much discussion in the Legislature this session.

State System officials are currently lobbying the Joint Ways and Means Education Subcommittee for approval of the State System's \$121 million biennial budget improvement request.

The governor has already trimmed that budget request to about \$25 million in improvements.

Several other bills that would affect Oregon college students have been introduced in the legislature, including three requested by the Oregon Student Lobby.

•Senate Bill 400 would create a Student Activities Fund, by which the interest earned on incidental fees, optional student fees, and student health service fees could be returned to student programs rather than to the state General Fund.

•House Bill 2412 will appropriate \$10 million from the state General Fund to the Oregon State Scholarship Commission for use in need grant

financial aid programs.

•House Bill 2472 would allow a student alleging discrimination based on race, religion, national origin, sex, marital status, age, or handicap to file a suit in state court.

Senate Joint Memorial 4, introduced in the Legislature at the request of OSL, urges the United States Congress to oppose the Reagan Administration's education budget reductions.

•Senate Bill 341 was introduced at the request of Goldschmidt and would begin a merit-based financial aid program aimed at stopping the so-called Oregon brain-drain trend of top Oregon scholars attending college out of state.

"SDI is the most gigantic hoax ever," he said, adding that SDI violates the Anti-Ballistic Missile (ABM) Treaty signed in 1972 between the United States and the Soviet Union. "When we started testing out of the lab in 1981, we violated the ABM Treaty. It was originally supposed to be confined to the lab by the agreement."

Bowman said research of lasers as weapons began around 1970. During his 22-year career in the Air Force, Bowman was responsible for all high energy laser developments for space and advanced surveillance

spacecraft development. On the KEZI Mid-Day Report Monday, Bowman said SDI has nothing to do with a defensive weapon. He said the United States' policy on arms control has been completely turned upside down by the Reagan administration since 1980 and 1981.

On the Report, Bowman stated the United States has abandoned war prevention for war fighting, saying the destruction of an evil empire has become a higher priority than preserving the United States, and that the American
