Marriage

Women who are college educated historically have had a lower chance of marrying than a woman with only a high school education, but that situation may be changing, according to Census Bureau reports.

According to Census Bureau demographer Jeanne Moorman, 58 percent to 66 percent of never-married, college-educated women age 30 in 1985 are likely to marry by the time they reach 65. This compares with 47 percent to 56 percent of never married, high school graduate women age 30.

Economic considerations may be one reason for the rise. With the increasing dependency on wages from both partners, higher education will heighten the desirability of any prospective mate.

Volunteers

A recent Gallup Poll found 89 million Americans, nearly half of the American population, volunteer an average of three-and-a-half hours a week and contribute more hours today than volunteers did five years ago.

Volunteers contributed just over two-and-a-half hours a week in 1980.

The most popular form of volunteering came in the form of assisting the elderly, the handicapped or a social welfare recipient. General fund raising is the second most common form of volunteering, amounting to 23 percent of the total amount conducted.

Volunteering is saving the recipient organizations \$110 billion.

Standard Of Living

Americans are increasing their standard of living by a rate of more than 20 percent every decade, according to an article in the March issue of the Compressed Air Magazine.

The standard of living is measured by the goods and services consumed by the average American.

With the increase, the average American need only work six minutes to buy a dozen eggs, down from 13 minutes in 1960. Seventeen minutes is the time required to buy a six-pack of beer, down from the half hour

necessary in 1960. The time worked necessary to buy a toaster has fallen from six hours in 1960 to two hours.

Forty percent of all Americans now own automobiles, up from 15 percent in 1960.

Wiskerinos

In search of recognition, sophomore men were apt to participate in the annual Sophomore Wiskerino beard growing contest, according to a Oct. 12, 1955, Oregon Daily Emerald article.

"Men will register at the same time they vote for Betty Coed at a special table," the article states.

Freshman women will then begin checking the beards five days later during dinnertime. Since the beard-growing practice is compulsory on most living organizations, punishment for not doing so will be determined by the individual organizations.

As a warning, Sophomore Wiskerino Chairman Gloria Begenlich stated all sophomore men who plan to attend the game in Portland are not to shave their beards.
