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Buckeyes—

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six shots, all on the inside or off the fast break, and did not put any points on the board until Landerholm, who misfired her first three attempts, canned a jumper three minutes into the contest.

"I think it was just a matter of having the jitters," acknowledged Landerholm afterward. "We knew they were the 10th-ranked team, and we wanted to come out strong and be aggressive right from the start, but we just rushed everything."

The Buckeyes were not executing well either, but anything was better than the Ducks' efforts at this point. It was forward Jodi Strine's 15-footer that capped a six-point run to give them an eight-point bulge, 27-19.

But the Oregon defense tightened, and the offense responded with a brief six-point flurry of its own, cutting the deficit to just a basket, 27-25.

That was as close as the Ducks would get. Ohio State came out the second half and outscored the Ducks 12-4 while motoring to a 14-point advantage in just five minutes.

The Buckeyes beat the Ducks in every phase of the game. The zone defense Oregon used was eventually the killer, as the Buckeyes — finishing with five players in double figures — could score inside with Hall and counter outside with Strine and Geneva Sanford.

Ohio State outshot the hosts 54 to 40 percent and out-rebounded the bigger Ducks by a 12-point margin, 42-30.

Landerholm struggled in her last collegiate game, converting just seven of 22 shots from the field en route to a 17-point night. She also had a team-high 11 rebounds. Neumann added 14 points.

While the Buckeyes head to Los Angeles for the West Region semi-final, the Ducks can shelve the uniforms until next October.

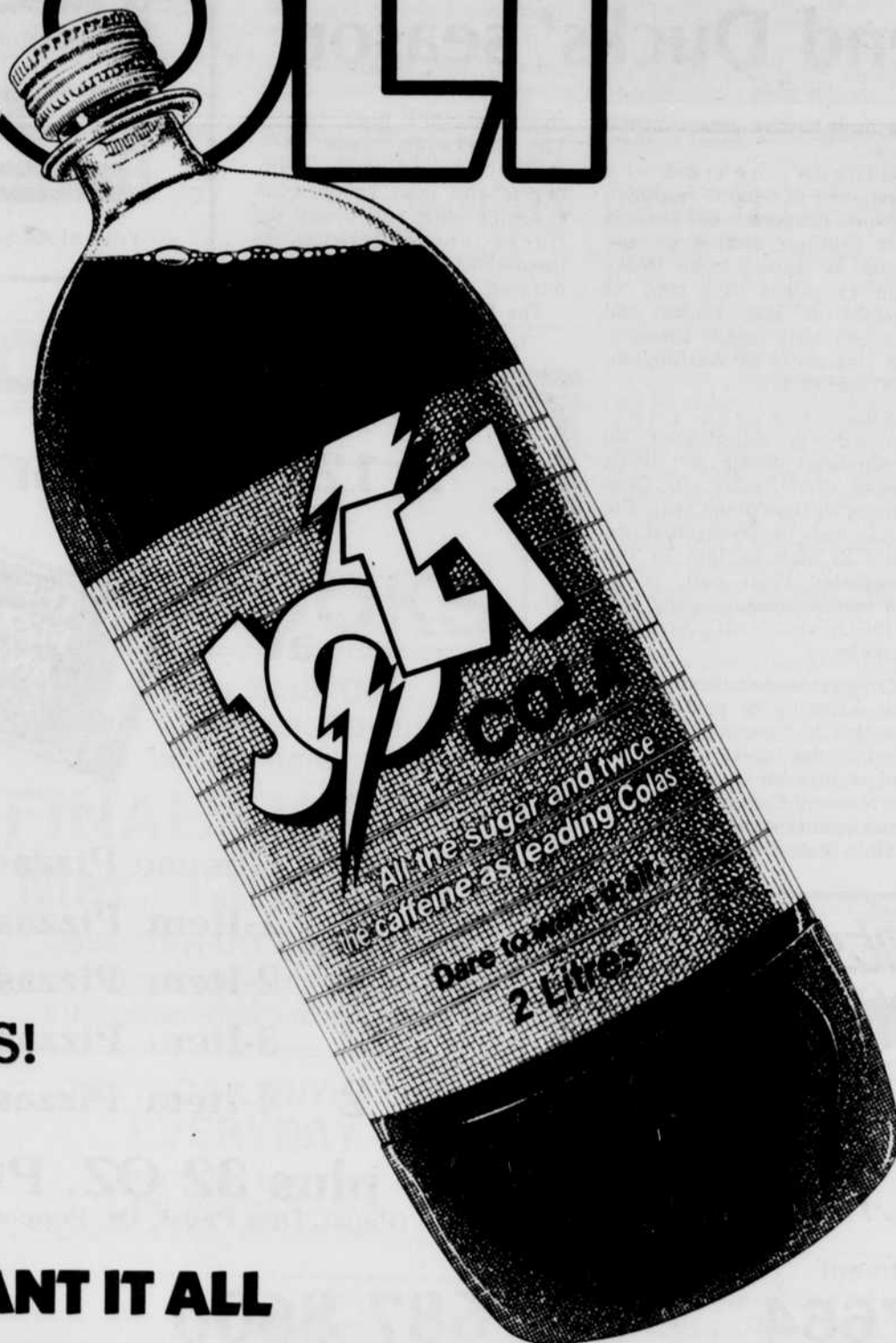
Oregon is losing an irreplaceable performer in the versatile Landerholm, but besides lacking a shooting threat from the outside, things look rather encouraging in what will be Heiny's 12th campaign at the helm.

"The future is maybe even brighter because we have some bright young players that are consistently playing better and better each game," Heiny said. "We will be missing some key seniors, and we'll have to juggle the lineup some."
