

Education abroad programs offer all unique experience

From Breukelen in the Netherlands to Tokyo, Japan; from Perugia, Italy, to Copenhagen, Denmark; from Queretaro, Mexico, to Great Britain, six summer programs offered through the Office of International Services are providing students the opportunity to visit foreign lands while they are sharpening their language and career skills.

The Netherlands

Participants in the Netherlands summer program stay at Nijenrode, the Netherlands School of Business, a summer school in international business. It was established just after World War II by leading Dutch enterprises such as KLM, Philips and Unilever.

According to Peter Miller, a student at the Netherlands School of Business for eight months last year, Breukelen is only 45 minutes south of Amsterdam, a prime recreation spot. Breukelen is a small town of 800 to 1,000 people.

The cost of the program for 1987 is \$2,145, which includes tuition for two courses, accommodations and meals on campus, field trips and all required learning materials. Students who wish to take three courses should add \$350 to the program fee.

The fee does not include transportation to and from the Netherlands.

There is a \$375 non-refundable application fee, but students who withdraw after acceptance into the program and before May 1 will receive a refund of \$125.

Japan

According to Paul Primak, assistant director of overseas study, participants in the Japan Business and Society Program have an opportunity to learn about the culture in a unique way. This is the first year the program has been offered.

Students will stay with families because living with Japanese natives decreases the time of participants' acculturation, Primak said. Students can learn much from the culture that gave us everything from the concept of bushido to the world-famous Japanese gardens at Kyoto.

"The cost of the program is

\$4,600, which includes tuition, room and board, field trips and round-trip airfare from Los Angeles," Primak said. It does not include learning materials. The higher cost of the program is due to the exchange rate between the American dollar and the Japanese yen.

Students spend time learning about Japanese business, society and culture. "Japanese management practices have had an enormous impact on how we view management," Primak said.

"Students will have an opportunity to talk with the people who put these kinds of techniques into practice," he said.

Italy

Students who wish to learn Italian or to brush up on the language may do so in the ancient Etruscan city of Perugia, Italy. Students begin study at the University for Foreigners in Perugia.

According to Debra Pore, a participant in last year's eight-week program, students participate in a language program "designed to facilitate the acquisition of the language. Students participate in language laboratories and study Italian art history and the Italian culture," she said.

The cost of the eight-week program is \$650, which includes tuition and field trips. It does not include learning materials or room and board. Estimated costs for accommodations is \$250 per month, Primak said. Estimated plane fares to Rome run about \$850.

Denmark

Architecture students have a unique opportunity to study Danish architecture through the Danish International Studies Program, located in Copenhagen, Denmark. "The Danish summer program is an architecture program, and you must be an architecture major to participate," Primak said.

Students participate in architecture studio work covering the areas of architectural design, urban and landscape design, interior and environmental design, and advertising and communications design as well as industrial design. Architecture students also participate in field studies including a four-day study tour of western Denmark and a one-week study tour in Finland. In addition, participants study ar-

chitectural and design highlights of Scandinavia and continental Europe.

The cost of the Danish International Studies Program is \$3,300, which includes tuition, housing with a Danish family, field trips, orientation and medical insurance. Students may pay for transportation to and from Denmark at the time they pay for the program or wait until a later time. Additional medical insurance must be purchased by the students.

Mexico

About two hours northwest of Mexico City lies the beautiful colonial city of Queretaro, Mexico, where every summer students have the opportunity to earn University credit, improve their Spanish and gain a valuable insight into another culture.

Summer in Queretaro is an intensive six-week program with small classes (maximum of eight students) in language, culture and history taught by Mexican instructors.

The program, which runs this year from June 28 through Aug. 7, is open to students who will have completed at least first-year Spanish by the end of spring quarter.

Jim Heinrich, a graduate student in Romance Languages and the director of the program, said the program's goal is to "develop some proficiency in Spanish grammar and comprehension of the language as well as gain an awareness and understanding of the culture."

Classes are held three hours a day, four days a week. Eight credit hours are given in language study, which satisfies two-thirds of the second-year Spanish requirements. Another four credits are awarded for study in culture and civilization.

Students who have completed second-year Spanish or beyond get more intensive instruction in literature, culture and history. All of the classes

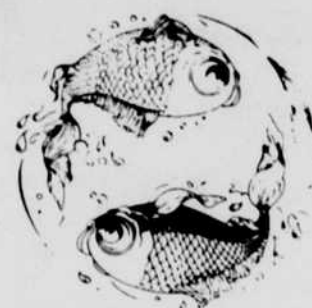
