

Oregon softball returns home after tough road schedule

The Oregon softball team will return home Saturday after a lengthy road trip over spring vacation.

The trip, which continues with a game today against Sonoma State in California, has proven to be a tough one for the Ducks.

The Ducks had a 6-9 record over spring break going into Tuesday's game at San Francisco State and a record of 4-9 in road games.

Oregon began action over spring break by sweeping a doubleheader from Linfield, 1-0 and 6-1. Oregon pitcher Sue Voeller tossed a no-hitter in game one. From there, the Ducks took to the road

to open their Pac-10 season against nationally ranked Arizona State. The Sun Devils swept a doubleheader, 9-2 and 2-0. Oregon remained in Arizona, traveling to Tucson to play the University of Arizona. The Wildcats were just as tough, sweeping another doubleheader, 4-0 and 8-0. The Ducks could manage only two hits in the two games.

On Monday, the Ducks split a doubleheader with Sacramento State. After returning home, the Ducks will face Lewis and Clark at home on Saturday in a game that was rescheduled after being rained out March 11. Oregon will take to the road again the following day with a game against Oregon State in Corvallis.

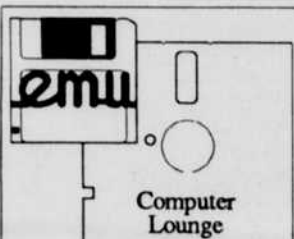
