State and Oregon Student Public Interest Research Groups. They are one organization, she said, but they keep two separate bank accounts that are kept in check by yearly audits and a comptroller in Corvallis. One holds IFC money the student group uses for its activities, and the other holds money raised through fund raising for the state group's projects.

One of the problems Randall and Munion see is OSPIRG has never been challenged.

Randall said he doesn't have a personal vendetta against OSPIRG and would question the activities of any campus organization he believed was as inherently political as OSPIRG.

"I have not seen groups like the Black Student Union or GALA (Gay and Lesbian Alliance) trying to shut down Hanford or putting out fliers

saying 'Shut down conservatives,' " he said.

Kirk said the purpose of the incidental fee system is to provide something for every student on campus. To deny a group funding because some people disagree with it is wrong, she said.

"It seems they (the petitioners) are questioning the fundamental rights of students to be politically active," she said.

lege to plan and organize the conversion to semesters, and they may be asked to put other tasks aside to help with the changeover, said Alison Baker, assistant to the University president.

Higher education officials contend that most problems faced by students moving from community colleges to four-year colleges in Oregon are easily worked out, and that the change to semesters will not create new problems.

State System Chancellor William Davis said many community college officials are enthusiastic about the four-year colleges' change to semesters.

But several legislators are unconvinced by the arguments of higher education officials.

House Bill 2913, sponsored by Reps. Margaret Carter and Ron Cease, both of Portland, would postpone the semester system conversion until the transfer credit issue is ironed out. That bill is expected to get a hearing before the House

Education Committee in mid-April.

That hearing is expected to include a discussion of the semester system, rules for transferring credits and a uniform numbering system for lower-division courses at community colleges and four-year colleges.

The Oregon Student Lobby opposed the semester system in January when the State Board decided in favor of the change. And Oeser said the OSL board of directors last month decided to support a bill sponsored by Rep. Darlene Hooley, D-West Linn, which would have required colleges and universities to keep the quarter system. Hooley's bill was recently combined with HB 2913.

Higher education officials argue that the decision to change to semesters was based on the precept that semester-long courses provide a better educational experience by allowing for more in-depth study of subjects, and that the Legislature should not intervene in such decisions.

Calvert and Carpenter will appear in 150 Geology at 7:30 p.m.

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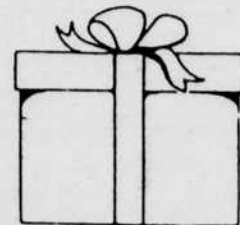


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
