Oregon men win 17 of 19 events as Huskies roll over for Ducks

Granted, the University of Washington men's track team will not make anyone's top ten list this season, but Oregon's devastating 125-33 dual meet win at Hayward Field on Saturday served notice that the Ducks are a team to be reckoned with.

The Ducks won 17 of 19 events and added 12 second-place finishes.

Two Oregon athletes qualified for the NCAA championships in June, although one was a repeat customer. Fifth-year senior Rick Bergesen made it two out of two, qualifying at 5000 meters in his second race of the season. In his first race, the 10,000 at the Oregon Preview, Bergesen exceeded the NCAA standard in that event. Saturday he beat the limit by just .03 seconds but finished strong, pulling away at the finish to win in 13:56.97.

Bergesen followed the strong lead of teammate Dan Nelson

for 3000 meters before making his move. Nelson finished second in 13:58.99, trimming over 12 seconds off his previous PR. "I'm a follower," admitted Bergesen. "He (Nelson) ran a great race and set a nice pace."

Sophomore weightman Jose deSouza uncorked a 190-4 on his fourth throw to win the discus and gain an NCAA bid by four inches. "I wasn't expecting anything like that today," said deSouza with genuine amazement just moments after the toss. "I threw terrible all week in practice and my first three didn't do anything. I don't know where that came from."

Whatever the source, the throw allowed deSouza to over-

take Washington's Dan Tabish (185-9), whose five throws all exceeded 180 feet, and established a new South American continental record, beating his own previous mark of 187-4.

deSouza also won the shot put with a toss of 58-11½.

J.J. Birden again scored a triple for Oregon as he won the long jump (25-0), the high hurdles (14.25 w) and moved up to the mile relay to help carry the Ducks to a 3:17.52 victory. Birden's most electrifying performance came in the relay. After receiving the baton 20 meters behind the Huskies on the third leg, Birden caught Eric
