Oregon women shut down PSU; men drop another match to Pilots

Heading into what may be the most important part of the schedule, the University men's and women's tennis teams looked to gain some momentum toward a possible Pacific 10 Conference Northern Division crown with home matches last weekend.

The women emerged successfully as they routed Portland State University 9-0, while the men dropped a disappointing 6-3 decision to the University of Portland.

The Ducks pushed their season record to 8-5 with their second shutout of the Vikings this season. This one may have been even easier than the first, as none of the matches even went three sets.

It sets the stage for a showdown with division favorite University of Washington next weekend at Pullman, Wash. Washington State University, Weber State University, and Idaho State University also are on the Ducks' crowded weekend slate.

"I think it could be the best weekend of tennis this season," said women's coach Sue Jacobsen. "In the past couple of weeks we've played very tough matches and some easy ones. It'll be good to play some middle-of-the-road opponents now."

It looks to be the first time in years that the Ducks may be able to hold their own against the powerful Huskies. "In the past we haven't even been competitive with them. A victory may not be realistic, but it's our goal to play as well as we can, and if we do that we will be competitive," Jacobsen said.

The other matches also will be a good test for the Ducks, as Jacobsen pointed out the Huskies are on a similar level with Oregon.

The men will also get a shot at the Huskies next weekend as they host Portland, Washington State, and Washington in the University Of Oregon Inter-collegiate Tennis Championships. Washington has won the Pac-10 Northern Division championship 11 years in a row and is an overwhelming favorite to repeat.

The Ducks' record stands at 4-7 after last weekend's matches. Coach Buzz Summers was hoping for a win against Portland, as the Pilots had

already defeated Oregon 5-4 in the Ducks' season opener. But the Ducks dropped five of the six singles matches and went home empty-handed.

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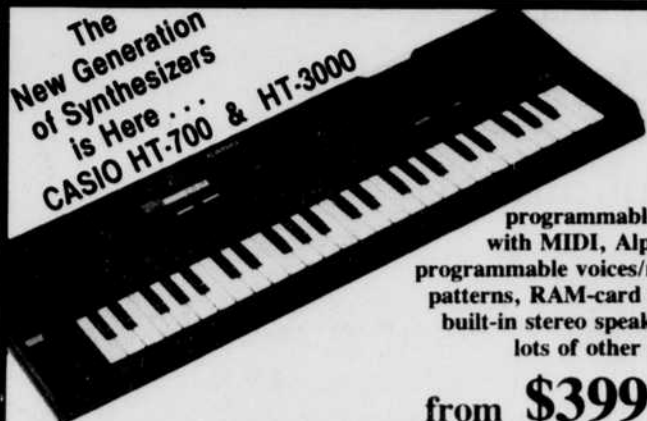
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
