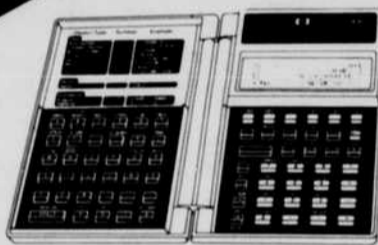

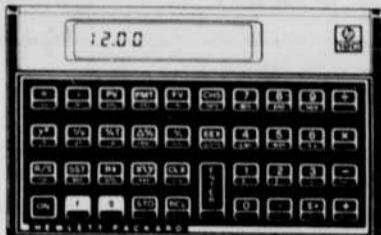

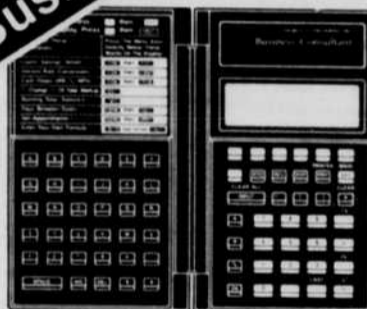

pads, requesting that schools remain open, negotiations continue and that a settlement be reached by Tuesday.

Negotiating teams met Saturday afternoon and evening and resumed talks Sunday afternoon. The two teams are meeting separately at the Hilton. On Saturday, several proposals were exchanged between the two groups. Details of the proposals have not been released.

State mediator John Vale said he was willing to continue the talks as long as progress was being made. Discussions on Saturday began with the bargaining teams meeting together in the same room, the first time the groups have met face to face in nine months.

Meanwhile, about 65 Eugene School District high school students gathered Saturday morning at Alton Baker Park to protest the strike and press for a settlement. Students marched from the park to the U.S. Courthouse in downtown Eugene carrying signs with "Stop the Strike" messages.

Eugene teachers will begin their strike at 6 a.m. on Wednesday if a settlement is not reached.
