ment wants to have multinational corporations mine. Banyacya spoke on behalf of his people at Geneva, during the United Nations Peace Talks.

"It is really easy to look outside the borders of our country and see problems, but we tend to ignore the discrimination and structural violence going on in our own country," Liebowitz said.

Renee Epelbaum of Argentina, a member of the Madres de Plaza de Mayo (Mothers of the Disappeared), will speak on Wednesday.

Shortly after the military coup in Argentina in 1976, Epelbaum's son, a doctor, disappeared. A disappearance occurs when someone is apprehended by the government or the security forces; however, the disappearance is not acknowledged.

Epelbaum fled to Uruguay in order to protect her other two children, but the Argentina military abducted the children with the assistance of the Uruguayan military. Epelbaum has since been searching for her children and been increasing efforts to bring attention to those responsible for their disappearance.

On Thursday, Bella Abzug, former Congresswoman from

New York, will bring a feminist perspective to peace. Abzug was elected to Congress in 1970, running on a platform advocating women's rights and an end to the Vietnam War. While in Congress she wrote the first law banning discrimination against women in obtaining credit, loans and mortgages.

In 1971 she co-founded Women Strike for Peace, and as WSP's national legislative representative, Abzug led lobbies and demonstrations to Washington, D.C., on behalf of the nuclear test ban, disarmament and an end to the war in Vietnam.

On Saturday there will be an exhibit of Guatemalan weaving, photography and children's drawings, and a benefit dance by Obo Addy and Kukrudu.

Proceeds will benefit the Caravan for the Forgotten, which is traveling to 40 cities to gather funds and supplies for Guatemalan refugee relief programs. The 20-member caravan will travel more than 4,000 miles in two months displaying the 200-piece exhibit.

Peace Week is co-sponsored by the ASUO and a coalition of 20 campus and community peace and justice organizations.
