Oregon tracksters head to WSU for repeat of last year's heroics

The "dog days" of spring are just a pleasant memory for the Oregon men's track team.

When the Ducks hit the field in Pullman, Wash., tomorrow for a dual-meet clash with arch-rival Washington State University, they hope to prove that there is more than one way to skin a cat.

More than just a win or a loss will be at stake. Oregon has won 11-straight dual meets over parts of the last three years, and their 86-77 victory over the Cougars last season knocked WSU out of the top spot in the

Track and Field News dual-meet rankings. The Ducks finished the season ranked second nationally, while the Cougars wound up fifth. Washington State coach Jim Chaplin has been pointing to Saturday's rematch ever since.

"(Chaplin) said last summer that this would be his biggest meet of the season, and that he was going to pull out all the stops to win," said Oregon coach Bill Dellinger.

The Oregon mentor acknowledged that this is a crucial contest, but downplayed the emphasis the Chaplin has placed on it. "Every time we go on the road we're somebody's 'big meet'," Dellinger said. "It's big for us, too, and we are going to run our key people at their best distances. But we have to be realistic, and we have other big meets coming up as well," he added.

Tomorrow's meet should evolve into a battle between the depth of the Ducks and some outstanding individual talent on WSU, according to Dellinger. "Every point is going to count," he predicted. "If they (WSU) do as well as they are capable of, they are going to be

awfully tough to beat."

The Cougars and Ducks are so closely matched that it is difficult to identify any one event that could prove pivotal, but Dellinger cited the sprints as critical to Oregon's success.

Oregon's best chances to rack up points appear to be in the steeplechase, the shot put, and the discus. They may get an additional boost from pole vaulter Jay Davis, but Dellinger said that the decision to enter Davis would depend on the weather conditions at Pullman and the closeness of the competition.

The meet may very well come down to the relays, which represent a 20-point swing in team scoring. If that is the case, Dellinger plans to evaluate the performances on Saturday to determine his lineups for those races.

For the Oregon women, the competition has also finally arrived.

After breezing past the University of Washington last week, the Oregon women's track team faces revenge-minded Washington State Saturday at Pullman, Wash.

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Golfers head south again

The Oregon men's golf team will tee it up this weekend when they take on a field of six Top-20 teams at the Fresno State Classic in Fresno, Calif.

Oregon goes into the tourney fresh off a come-from-behind, three-stroke victory over a 20-team field in the rain-plagued Northern California Intercollegiate. Trailing by 10 strokes going into the final round, Oregon weathered windy and rainy conditions to splash their way to the first team title of the year.

However, it will be harder for the Ducks to repeat that feat in Fresno. Tourney entrants Brigham Young University, USC, UCLA, University of Arizona, Arizona State University and Fresno State University are all rated ahead of the 19th-ranked Ducks.

The course in Fresno will favor the big hitters. It's much longer than the Elkhorn course, where the Ducks won over spring break, and the greens are a lot faster.

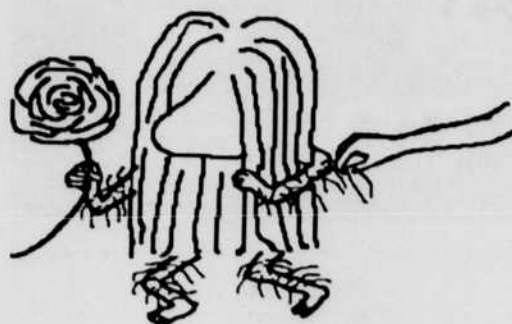
Coach Scott Krieger sees the Ducks finishing in the top six, but said, "We're going down there to try and win it all."

If the Ducks are going to win it all, Krieger must get good performances from all the golfers and not just a few. "We have a tendency to spray the ball off the tee. We've got to keep the ball in play," he said.

"We need excellent play from everyone. It's awfully difficult to win tournaments if a couple of guys are playing bad, because it puts a lot of pressure on those playing good," Krieger said.

Those playing good of late are seniors Steve Rintoul and Rob Huff. Rintoul took fourth individually in the last tournament, including a second-round low of 70, and Huff was consistent throughout and tied for eighth.

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
