# IFC candidate says process biased

Wayne Skill is running for a position on the Incidental Fee Committee because he said he believes each group on campus needs equal representation.

Skill said all groups that benefit students deserve ASUO funds.



"The smaller groups on campus are traditionally under-represented here," he said. Although he said groups that benefit large amounts of students deserve priority he said he doesn't think small groups should be excluded.

Skill would also like to see a reorganization of the IFC.

"I am upset with the way student monies are spent in an irresponsible manner," he said. "I also think there are problems with the way accounts are handled."

If elected he said he will propose that the surplus account be reconstructed so groups can retain a portion of their unused money instead of giving it back.

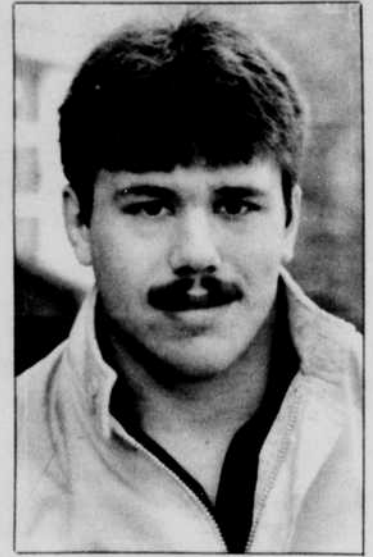
A fourth-year architecture student, Skill has been involved in wrestling for four years, and has received both an Army-ROTC scholarship as well as a presidential scholarship.

"I have a diverse background of the things I've been involved in. I have a certain amount of understanding of fiscal issues," he said.

Skill said further he believes that the role of the IFC should be non-political and strictly fiscal.

"We cannot allow personal biases to conflict with groups. In the past the IFC has been biased in the allocation of funds to certain groups and it cannot be allowed," Skill said.

One priority Skill noted is to make the IFC more accessible to students. He would like to see more interaction between the

IFC, the ASUO, and the student body.

Skill has been endorsed by Concerned Students for Responsive Leadership, a recently formed political party that has endorsed candidates for the ASUO Executive, the IFC, and EMU Board positions. Skill said CSRL stands for positive leadership from a diverse background that has been lacking recently in ASUO.

The fire was contained to the room corner by fire fighters. Smoke damage and a burned mattress were about the extent of the damage, Wilcox said. Fire officials estimated damages at \$500.

The fire marshal will investigate the incident Monday, Wilcox said. The west side of Hamilton complex was evacuated for about 45 minutes because of the fire.

"We think it was electrical,

but we have to wait to hear what the fire marshal said," Notdurft said.

No one was hurt in either incident, said campus security officials.

The University Physical Plant will repair damage within the week, said Marjory Ramey, University Housing Director. If someone is found to be responsible for the dryer fire, he or she will be responsible financially, Ramey said.
