The details of this explanation are cumbersome and unnecessary. It was like instructional material rather than

entertainment.

There were things I did like about this film — there were some interesting characters.

Gale and Neville are a pair of convicts who break out of prison and hole up in the McDonnough trailer. They portray moronic misanthropes well.

Their first morning in the McDonnough household, they sit at the breakfast bar slurping cornflakes and milk, and leering at Ed as she feeds the baby his bottle.

"Ma'am," Neville tells her.

"Ya don't breast feed 'im, he hates ya for it later. That's why we ended up in prison."

Hi's boss, Glenn, and his wife, Dot, are another interesting pair.

Glenn complements Dot's loud, neurotic personality with his buck-toothed swinger character.

The set details also lent a positive note to this film. The McDonnoughs belonged in their cardboard trailer with television tables, for instance.

Enter Carlton Whitfield, alias Brantley Foster, also played by Fox. Whitfield, who has gained employment simply by taking over a vacated office, is everything Brantley Foster couldn't be as himself. And no one questions the presence of the new and unknown business executive.

It is these dueling personalities, combined with the effects of a romantic interest and an unyielding desire for success, that keep the charades moving haphazardly along.

The movie may go slightly astray in its lack of moral and ethical issues. There is an absence of the socially positive or reinforcing pathways to success that would have been nice to see, especially in a time when the business world is often seen as corrupt. And again, reality is another ingredient short in measure.

Nevertheless, taken lightly, with its catchy soundtrack and comic intensity, "The Secret of My Success," is a funny and fast-paced piece of film making that should please Fox fans and most audiences alike.

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
