hibiting unlicensed legal practice, he said.

"The Oregon Bar Association now has asked for unchecked authority to sue and censor anyone who discusses law with another individual," said Bill Thompson of the DBA Divorce Service in Portland.

Thompson has been giving legal advice and writing do-it-yourself manuals dealing with various aspects of the law for about 13 years, he said. But he has no formal legal training.

But "someone's general opi-

nion on a legal matter is not considered to be in the prohibition," Reimer said.

Thompson said "consumers will be the ultimate losers because they won't have access to inexpensive legal services." And lawyers will be the ultimate winners if the bill passes because they will have sidestepped current anti-trust laws, he added.

Current anti-trust laws prohibit the OSB from bringing suit against any party, according to Thompson.

"A person should be allowed to say anything anywhere," Thompson said. He claims the bill, as written, violates the First Amendment right to free speech.

But Reimer said things can be very complicated in the case of law, and if a person is not properly trained, mistakes can be made. He said he sees the bill as consumer protection legislation.

"If you're dealing with someone not licensed, the public has no recourse," he said. If a lawyer makes a mistake, the client can be compensated because of malpractice insurance, Reimer added.

Para-legals are not the only ones who would be touched by the bill if it is made law, Muse said.

She lists tax preparers, escrow offices, realtors and insurance agents among those who may be affected by the legislation.

She added the bill doesn't provide the right of a jury trial for those who might be brought before the court by the OSB.

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
