

Childcare expert Dr. Spock to speak about nuclear threat

Dr. Benjamin Spock believes the nuclear arms race is an issue vital to the safety and well-being of children. Spock, whose 1946 book on childcare became a bible to generations of parents, is the keynote speaker tonight as part of Earth Week events held at the University this week.

Spock will speak at the EMU Ballroom at 7:30 about living with the threat of nuclear war and the need for political action.
