One veteran local blues band, The Lost Falcons, has developed a substantial following in Eugene. They have played with The Blasters, and currently are planning a tour with the legendary blues great, Screaming Jay Hawkins.

"Because Eugene is limited in terms of places to perform, a band such as ours, which plays regularly in the area, has to

be careful not to saturate the market," said Lost Falcons guitarist Henry Cooper.

Cooper said he enjoys playing at the beer gardens, which not only provides a different atmosphere for the band to play in, but also exposes the group to a different audience.

Besides local talent, many other lesser-known bands pass through Eugene during their regional and national tours. One such group, Saqqara Dogs, who originally hail from New York, recently performed at the University.

While only together for a year and a half, the three members of Saqqara Dogs have performed previously in bands including The Lounge Lizards, The Con-tortions and Factrix.

Guitarist Bond Bergland stressed the importance of reaching a relatively wide and diverse audience.

Another relatively new band that performed on April 15 at the EMU Beer Garden is The Connells, a five-piece band out of Raleigh, N.C. The Connells, on their first tour of the West Coast, have been featured on MTV's, "The Cutting

Edge."

The Connells perform a mixture of English post-punk and American guitar sounds, which reflects a revitalization of good old-fashioned American rock 'n' roll. The Connells have been compared to R.E.M., The Smiths and Lloyd Cole and the Commotions. The Connells have been called one of the best new bands of the year by The East Village Eye.

For those interested in a more raw, hard-core sound, T.S.O.L., a band out of Los Angeles will be performing in Eugene in the near future.
