California slated to be first guest at newly renovated Howe Field

Life will be injected back into Howe Field this weekend.

When the Oregon softball team entertains sixth-ranked University of California at the renovated complex Sunday at 1 p.m., it will be the first NCAA action the turf has seen since the Athletic Department wielded its budget-cutting ax upon the Oregon baseball squad back in May 1981.

Since that time, the field has been used periodically by the Club Sports baseball team.

Meanwhile, the softball team was playing on the makeshift diamond behind Hayward Field, where it experienced frequent drainage problems and schedule conflicts with track meets.

"Cal would have otherwise come on a Saturday when there was a track meet, and we would have had to move them to Amazon, which means no home field and no home crowd," said Chris Voelz, assistant athletic director.

Transforming Howe Field for softball use has been on the Athletic Department's agenda for the past three years, but those same budget constraints that cut baseball prevented the renovation.

Named for Hubert C. Howe, the University's faculty athletic representative from the early 1900's to 1940, Howe Field was constructed in 1936 under the Public Works Administration. The PWA allowed the government to provide workers for organizations that had building materials to use.

It was that same sort of economizing that reduced the original \$65,000 price tag of the current project to \$12,000. Voelz attributes the decrease to a good deal on sod for the field, funds from the Barker Foundation and assistance from volunteers and the University's maintenance staff.
