statewide uniform-numbering system.

"There will be a marginal impact on departmental freedom regarding the numbering of courses, but I don't think it will be a significant problem," said Holland. "Courses with the same content, at the same level, ought to have uniform numbers so community colleges know what to target when designing their programs."

College and university administrators in the State System are going to resist the uniform numbering idea, Pierce said. He will have to play a major role in smoothing that resistance if the bill becomes law. "It's not going to be easy," he admitted.

"I would like to see a reasonable approach taken by all parties," cautioned Education Committee Vice Chairman Ted Calouri, R-Beaverton. "If two courses on two different campuses are found to be substantially the same with only minor differences... we should encourage (the campuses) to come up with as much similarity and agreement as possible to benefit students who transfer."

Calouri said he hoped the uniform numbering process would not deteriorate into a battle between campuses trying to define the curriculum with an attitude of "we win, you lose." Committee member Carl

Hosticka, D-Eugene, voted in favor of the bill. But Hosticka, a University professor, had reservations about legislative interference in educational matters.

"It's good for universities and community colleges to coordinate programs, but you can tie education up in red tape that's not good for either side," he said.

"I would judge that most community colleges would find it advantageous to convert to the semester system," Post said.

Holland said a semester system conversion is more work than most community colleges will probably want to undertake.

Others argued Beam's actions made it appear that all committee members are ultra-conservatives, with many testifying they are more liberal and moderate Republicans.

Protocol means notifying the CR club before distributing information or campaigning on campus, which he said was the club's political territory.

Before the pamphlet discussion, both Cushing and Nichols vied for a precinct worker position with the committee, along with several others. After a committee vote all candidates but Cushing and Nichols were accepted.

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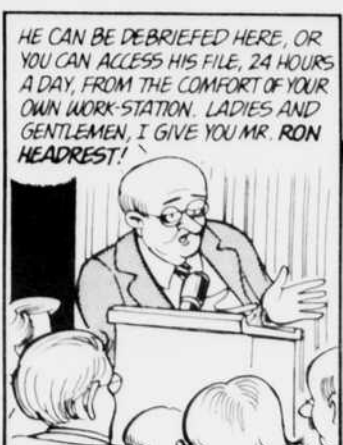
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
