Oregon splits with Beavers in wacky Civil War twin-bill

Oregon won the first game of its Civil War softball double-header in extra innings on Monday, but got a dose of its own medicine when Oregon State University rallied to steal the nightcap, also in extra innings.

With the 1-0, 2-1 split, the Ducks move their overall record to 21-28, 2-8 in the Pacific 10 Conference.

In the opener, pitchers Sue Voeller of Oregon and OSU's Karen Schoonover battled through eight scoreless innings.

The Beavers threatened in the top of the first, loading the bases for Mary Ellen Mansfield with just one out. The Ducks quickly put out the fire, however, turning a double play to end the inning and get Voeller out of a jam. Oregon State's best opportunity of the

game had slipped away, and Voeller wasn't about to give the Beavers another chance.

The Oregon hurler, who has already set the Oregon single season record for strikeouts (94), began shooting the Beavers down one by one, giving up only a walk over the final eight innings.

Schoonover, meanwhile, was pitching a strong game herself. The Ducks could manage only one hit, a single by Capi Lynn, over the first six innings.

In its half of the seventh, Oregon's Jeanna King, with a scorching bat of late, led off with a ground-rule double to the fence in left-center field. She reached third on a Kira Lewis sacrifice, but Schoonover worked her way out and the teams headed to extra-innings.

With one out in the bottom of the ninth, King lined a base hit single up the middle and was sacrificed to second by Lewis.

Cheryl Coryell then drilled a single to left, but Oregon coach Teresa Wilson opted to hold King at third. Paula Barnes drew a walk, and the bases were full for catcher Stacye Gustafson.

The Ducks wouldn't need Gustafson's bat, however, as a Schoonover pitch got by OSU catcher Jo-Ann Yatogo, and King sprinted in with the winning run.

The nightcap was "disappointing," to say the least for

the Ducks. When the Oregon's Gustafson scored on a passed ball in the ninth inning, the Ducks had a 1-0 lead and appeared headed for a sweep of their intrastate rivals.

But Oregon State wouldn't die, as the Beavers rallied in their half of the ninth when Tammy Laird doubled to lead off and scored on Mary Pietrok's single to right. Two batters later, with the bases loaded, Karen Schoonover bunted safely and scored Pietrok from third with the game-winner.

"It's frustrating," said Lynn, who plays first base. "We didn't hit the ball that well in the first game, but Jeanna got on there at the end and we got a lucky break."

"In the second game, we hit better but we couldn't make the

clutch plays. We make those routine plays all the time, but we just didn't get the ball out of our gloves," she added.

King, the Ducks' freshman center fielder, continued her torrid pace, going two for four with a double in game one, and three for four and a stolen base in the nightcap.

"Jeanna's been knockin' the cover off the ball," Wilson said. "We've DH'd (designated hitter) her all year, but she decided she wanted to hit, and ever since she's been playing great offensively and defensively."

Voeller's shutout in game one was her seventh of the year, a new Oregon single season mark; and Lewis' two hits in game two tied a pair of Oregon season records — most doubles (6) and most hits (38).

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played steady throughout while shooting a 148 that left him with the second-best overall score on the team behind Rintoul.

Oregon's hopes of claiming its first Pac-10 tourney will become reality only if Rintoul's example is followed. "Everybody has to shoot under par tomorrow for us to be in a good position in the last

round," Hval said.

Tee off times for the third round today begin at 10 a.m. and continue through the afternoon until 2 p.m.



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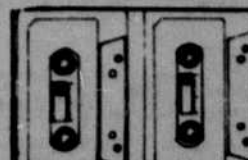
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
