

Airband competition kicks off Greek Week

The annual airband competition between all University Greek houses will kick off 1987 Greek Week tonight at Mac Court at 7 p.m.

Charles Arant-Jones, Interfraternity Council chairman; and Lisa Boyer, Panhellenic Council activities chairwoman, coordinate the week's events along with Greek Activities Council. The council is composed of 10 Greek men and women from various houses.

The week is based on a point system. Each event is worth a certain number of points for each sorority and fraternity capturing first, second, and third places. Judges are selected from both the University and community for each event.

Tuesday, a progressive dinner exchange is scheduled. Each sorority and fraternity house will serve three courses: salad, dinner and dessert. The purpose of the dinner is to get members from every house to meet, mix and get acquainted with each other.

Both a pancake breakfast and a serenade will be held on Wednesday. The pancake breakfast is sponsored by the Junior Panhellenic Council and will be held in the EMU dining room. A slide show will be presented during breakfast.

The Greek serenade starts at 6 p.m. on Wednesday. Sorority members will travel to different fraternities during assigned

time slots and perform.

Thursday is Games Day. The games included a balloon toss, pyramid relay, 4-legged race, dunk booth and a tug-o-war. These events will take place on the upper field on 18th Avenue and University Street at 3:30.

One of the biggest events of the week is the variety show on Friday, which is designed to unite Greeks and their parents before Parent's Weekend. Each house will perform a three- to five-minute act. The show will be held at the Hult Center-Sylvia Concert Hall and starts at 7 p.m. Tickets are available for \$3.

KSND radio station is sponsoring the Greeks by announcing the events of each day, and will be giving away 30 pairs of tickets during the week.

A Canoe Fete and awards ceremony will be held on Saturday to end the week. The fete theme is "A Day at the Movies," and judging will be at 3 p.m. on the mill race.

One difference in this year's competition is the complete elimination of alcoholic substances, Arant-Jones said. Last year, the variety show replaced a traditional "beer chug," and Arant-Jones stressed this year alcohol should not be a part of any activity.

"Drinking is not conducive to what the Greek system is trying to do," Arant-Jones said. "We don't want to promote events where people just want to get drunk."

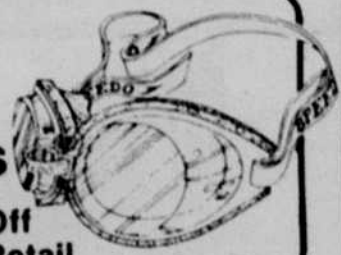
