## Pole, Pedal, Paddle: 'chaotic and fun'

From Mount Bachelor to Bend, 2,900 compete in five events.



More than 2,900 athletes swarmed on Bend, Ore., over the weekend to compete in the annual Pole, Peddle, Paddle competition sponsored by U.S. Bank of Oregon. Boasting 100 team entries more than last year, the event covered 32 miles — from snowy Mount Bachelor to the Deschutes River to the race finish at Mirror Pond in downtown Bend.

The five-event competition included downhill and cross-country skiing, bicycling, kayaking/canoeing and running. Although ski conditions were poor because of warm weather, the race ran smoother than in past years, according to Race Director Marilyn Karnopp. "The snow conditions were tough, but we felt like it was a real multi event."

For the second straight year, Dan Simoneau of Bend crossed the line first in 1:56:50.3. Simoneau has

competed on two U.S. Olympic Nordic ski teams and recently was named U.S. Cross-Country Skier of the Year. In the women's division, Kristine Bruegger of Switzerland was first in 2:05:21.2. Bruegger was fifth in the Nordic Skiing World Championships this year and is Switzerland's nordic national cross-country champion.

University senior Alex Margolin and Team Bigfoot placed second in the men's 20 to 24-year-old division. Other University students on his team were: John Mooney, kayaking; Mark Lobl, downhill skiing; and Lee O'Conner, biking and running. Margolin is coach and coordinator of the University nordic ski team.

"It was total chaos. We never knew how we were standing, but it was a really fun day," Margolin said.

## Teigen wins fee committee recount...again

The ASUO Elections Board on Friday confirmed Kristin Teigen's election to the Incidental Fee Committee.

Teigen came out ahead of Collin Farrell 1,155 to 1,131, a difference of 24 votes. This total matched the results of a second recount held shortly after the general elections, Elections Board member Doug Stello said.

The recount was called by Farrell, who has expressed displeasure at a

lack of consistent results. Farrell called for previous recounts, and he maintained he had yet to see the same numbers twice.

In the general election held April 22-23, Teigen defeated Farrell by 15 votes. Originally, the one-year IFC race was to be determined in the primary election April 15-16, with the top three vote recipients winning. However, because of write-in candidates the race was forced to the general election ballot.

Farrell received the second-highest number of votes in the

primary, finishing behind Sandra Thompson and ahead of Steve Hoyt. In the primary, Teigen was 224 votes behind Farrell.

Duane Dungannon, student senator-elect and Oregon Commentator editor, attended the early recounts and was not satisfied with the results. He said he is still not convinced, but is willing to accept the results of the latest recount. He added he will not ask for another recount.

"I don't want to make any allegations that I can't prove," Dungan-

non said. "But I still have questions."

Dungannon and several other students were disappointed they never heard when and where the recounts would be held, he said.

Teigen said she was glad she won, although she really didn't expect to lose.

"I understand his (Farrell's) frustration with the results. I did win by a narrow margin," she said. "Yet I find his process childish, but that's inconsequential now that it's all over."
