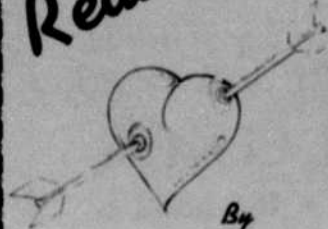

as a propaganda photo session. Chetwynd presents a sequence in which the men receive letters and several disclose personal bits that help us know them better. But by this time the movie is almost over. We've already been through hell with them.

Chetwynd also presents an unattractive and grossly caricatured picture of the media covering the prisoner-of-war scene. Reporters who attend staged press conferences ask the prisoners to apologize for killing innocent women and children and totally ignore statements by the prisoners informing them of the real conditions inside the prison.

Technically, the film is pretty good. The photography does an adequate job of showing us what we need to know.

The sound is an interesting blend of Jimmy Webb tunes and stars and stripes orchestration mixed with Oriental riffs which complement the action but don't upstage it.
