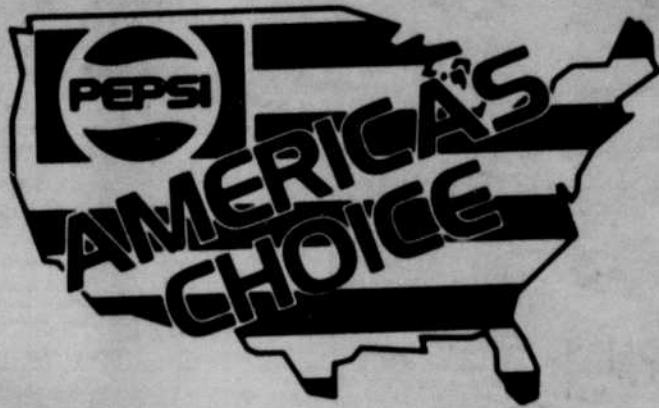

The Oregon wrestling squad hosts the Swedish national team tonight in an exhibition at McArthur Court.

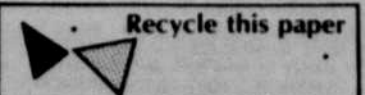
The event kicks off at 7:30 p.m. Admission is free.
