## Science V underway

A Eugene company is planning to begin construction on the \$13.1 million Science V building "on or about Tuesday" of next week, project manager Jim Thomas said.

Starting Monday, traffic will be restricted to one-way, westbound, on the East 13th Avenue between Carson Hall and University streets. Traffic will also be one-way, southbound, on University from 13th Avenue to Johnson Lane. Johnson Lane is the small road behind Johnson Hall.

These traffic patterns will be in effect for the next one to two years, Thomas said. Science V, to be located on East 13th Avenue across from the EMU, is the first and largest building in the University's planned \$45.6 million science complex.

The Wildish Building Co. of Eugene, part of the Wildish group of companies headquartered in Phoenix, Ariz., was the low bidder for the project.

The building's design incorporates an east and west wing connected with a central atrium. The building will contain offices, laboratories and classrooms for physics, chemical physics, biophysics, theoretical science and materials science.

William Neland, associate vice chancellor for the Oregon State System of Higher Education, estimates that the total three-year science construction project will provide the equivalent of one year of 550 construction jobs.

Science V is scheduled to be finished by the fall of 1989.

## Provost search extended

University President Paul Olum has re-opened the search for a new provost and vice president of academic affairs. The new closing date for applications is October 15.

The current provost, Richard Hill, has agreed to continue in the position until Jan. 1, 1988.

In January of this year, Hill announced his intention to resign and return to teaching and research in the sociology department.

The 14-member provost search committee had originally intended to complete the search by spring, according to chairman Theodore Palmer, associate dean of the College of Arts and Sciences.

"We had some highly qualified candidates, but we really would like to have about four or five who would be good enough to come here for visits, and we doubted that we had that many," Palmer said.

The pool of highly qualified candidates may have been small as a result of the awkward timing and short period of time for the original search process, Palmer said. Another reason to extend the search was to avoid interviewing candidates during the summer when many faculty members would be away from the University, he added.

The committee considered at least one of the applicants from within the University to be highly qualified, Palmer said.

## Library extends hours

The University library will extend hours until 2 a.m. for eight days during Dead and Finals Weeks, Wednesday, June 3 through Wednesday June 10. Extended hours will be in effect at the Architecture and Allied Arts, and Science libraries, as well as at the Main Library.

Circulation service, study space and access to the collections will be available. No reference service will be provided after early evening hours.

## Bookstore board elected

Four students and one faculty member have been elected to two-year terms on the University Bookstore's board of directors.

Freddy Vilches, a student majoring in Spanish and music, was elected to the freshman seat on the board. Sophomore seats went to Brian Snowden, a pre-business administration student, and Kristin Teigen, an English major.

Joern Wetter, a psychology major, was re-elected to the graduate student position, while the faculty post went to John Foster, a sociology professor.

The University Bookstore is a non-profit organization unaffiliated with the University but intended to serve the needs of the University community.

Board members attend monthly meetings and receive a \$20 monthly stipend.
