Folk Festival

Queen Ida and her Bon Temps Zydeco Band will serve up a Cajun-flavored evening of music on Saturday, May 30, as part of the 17th annual Willamette Valley Folk Festival. A singer and button accordion player, Queen Ida is the first female band leader in the zydeco tradition, which was created by the Creole, Black and Cajun communities of Louisiana.

The festival offers three days of music and related workshops from May 29 to May 31. Fans of various styles of traditional and contemporary folk, as well as of acoustic music will find what they want during the weekend. The music will play throughout each afternoon with a break at 6:30 for dinner, followed by the main act at 8. All shows will be on the main stage of the EMU east lawn.

Those attending the event will be treated to traditional folk music from Chico Schwall, celtic sounds from Flying Haggis, and a dash of salsa from Sandunga and Caliente, just to mention a few examples. Although Queen Ida headlines Saturday's show, Friday will see marimba music from Dumi and Minanzi III, and Sunday will offer the fine blues of Matt "Guitar" Murphy.

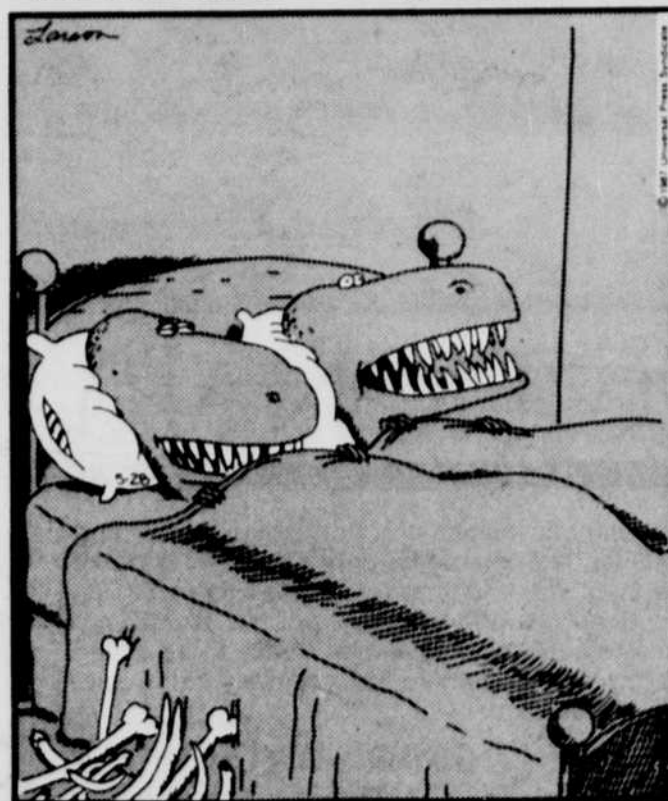
