Tentative plans to build a pasta factory, which would employ three times as many people as the cheese factory also are being considered, Funk said. The pasta factory would be built adjacent to the cheese factory.

The final hurdle, once the bond sale is approved by the treasurer, will be to sell the bonds, Smith said. Most bond sales of this nature are sold to a single customer, such as a bank or a mutual fund, in a private placement, he said.

added.

For the past few years tuition has been \$495.50 per term for in-state students and \$1,396.50 for out-of-state students.

It is still not known whether there will be a tuition increase next year as the state Legislature has not determined whether an increase is necessary, Nishimura said. In the past when an increase has occurred it has been a 3 percent increase, he said.

The Legislature is expected to come to a decision by July 1, he added.

Next year the entrance requirement for admission to the University has been raised from a 2.75 grade-point average to 3.0. This change has not had any negative effects on the amount of people applying to the school, Nishimura said.

In fact, the change could be considered a positive one because it is attracting "some of the better students in the state," he said.

One of the reasons the higher GPA requirement was established was to better manage enrollment, he added.

Along with increased enrollment, a housing crunch also is expected to occur at the beginning

of the school year, said Marjory Ramey, the director of University housing. At the moment, the residence halls have capacity enrollment, she said.

The housing department is in the process of sending letters to those students who are on the waiting lists telling them to begin looking for housing if they are not assigned a dormitory room by mid-August, she said.

The housing department will open its housing services hotel Aug. 24. For an \$8 per-night charge, admitted students can stay at the hotel while looking for housing, Ramey said.

The housing department also is urging the ASUO-run Off-Campus Housing office to open in time for the Early Orientation Registration Program, which is when many entering students will begin looking for housing, Ramey said.

Last year the housing department and the dean of students' office provided some money to support the Off-Campus Housing office in order for it to open early, she said.

In regard to the expected housing shortage, Ramey said, "It is definitely a major issue."

The amount of off-campus

housing available often is determined by how often the dorms fill up, said Maureen Nolan, the assistant director at the Off-Campus Housing office.

If continuing students wait until the last minute to find housing, a crunch similar to the one at the beginning of this school year will result, she said.

The office already is receiving calls and letters from around the United States and around the world from students who are looking for housing for the fall, Nolan said.

Usually the rush for housing starts in August, she said.

While the staff at the off-campus housing office do not know how many new students are expected or how fast the dorms will fill up, they do have several suggestions for students who will be looking for off-campus housing.

The first suggestion is for students to start looking for accommodations early. Another suggestion is for students to use the Off-Campus Housing office, which lists available apartments and houses. The office can also give students guidelines regarding renters' rights and how to read a rental lease.

variable credit practica be converted to the semester system?"

The EMU administration is concerned that events such as the Willamette Valley Folk Festival, which are held after May 10th, will have to be rescheduled for fall to ensure decent weather. Also, some Outdoor Program activities that usually occur in the late spring might have to be discontinued.

The Admissions Office could be swamped with concerns over transfer courses when the general University requirements are changed.

The International Services Office suggests that dormitories remain open for foreign students who cannot afford to leave campus during the month-long break between fall and spring semester.

And the ISO is concerned that the semester system will eliminate some of the flexibility that students enjoy with the three-quarter system, and students may find it more difficult to take time out for participation in study-abroad programs.

The Office of the Registrar listed several problems to solve, including the conversion of credit hours and grade point averages.

A 4.0 gpa in quarter-long classes does not necessarily convert to a 4.0 gpa in semester-long classes. "A decision must be made as to whether the converted totals will be whole numbers or fractions."

The disbursement of financial aid and the payment of deferred

tuition may have to be rescheduled. Late registration and drop-add charges may have to be changed.

The status of an academic summer session, once the semester conversion is in place, remains buried in questions.

The list of concerns for the Housing Department includes the stayover policy, which may need changing, for the longer Christmas vacation, and the scheduling of conferences and visitations.
