## Emerald's Athletes of the Year For work ethic, Landerholm was tops

Choosing the outstanding female athlete of the year was not an easy task.

Athletes like volleyball player Teri Kramer and tracksters Annette Hand and Penny Graves each had superior seasons. The Oregon Daily Emerald's selection of basketball's Lauri Landerholm recognizes an athlete whose performance stands above the rest.

Landerholm epitomizes the college athlete who surpasses others in achievement simply because she works harder perfecting her skills than others.

"I work hard to prove to myself how good I can be — that's enough to drive me right there," Landerholm said. "Last summer, I realized that the team's success would have to do with how I performed."

Landerholm's accomplishments speak for themselves.

She was chosen as the Pacific 10 Conference Player of the Year, led the Ducks with 18.2 points a game and established a single-season school record for assists with 171.

The senior from Gresham completed her collegiate career as Oregon's all-time assist leader (607), third-leading scorer (1,783 points) and fifth-best career rebounder (619).

Landerholm was also selected to the Kodak All-District VIII team for the second-straight year.

When we last left Landerholm, it was a teary atmosphere in the bowels of McArthur Court. Amid the sorrow of losing last March's NCAA tourney game to Ohio State University, 76-62, Landerholm had difficulty addressing the media. Her eyes reflected a spirit drowned by defeat.

But in retrospect, Landerholm will be remembered for a spectacular season that secured her a place

as one of Oregon's best ever. And that's worth another look.

Throughout her years at Oregon, Landerholm was the case study of an athlete who was dedicated to becoming better, rather than just good. Her time spent in the gym — outside of required team practices — was characteristically time devoted to fundamentals. It was often regimented and repetitious. "The best athletes spend the most time at it. Lauri did this," said her coach, Elwin Heiny.

On the court, Landerholm had an awesome presence about her. She could control a game without physically dominating it.

When she got into her rhythm, which was most of the time, she was virtually unstoppable. Her ability to score was backed by the threat of her passing game.

Happily married and a physical education major with a 3.2 grade point average, Landerholm looks forward to continuing her basketball career. Next week she plans on being one of 10 to 15 American women who will pursue play in Italy.

Those who surround themselves in sport know that the work ethic usually determines the best of the best. Lauri Landerholm illustrates this better than anyone else.

## Miller was Oregon's most prolific QB

One would almost think Chris Miller had already reaped every available award.

But there is nothing left to do but offer the Oregon Daily Emerald's Male Athlete of the Year to perhaps the most proficient Oregon competitor since Ron Lee ruled the Kamizee Kids of Oregon basketball in the 70's and was drafted as a professional in both football and soccer, in addition to his specialty.

"He's a guy we wanted all along," touted coach Marion Campbell, after his Atlanta Falcons nabbed Miller with the 13th pick of the first round in last April's National Football League draft.

And for good reason. A two-time, all-Pacific 10 Conference performer, Miller rewrote every

statistic in the Oregon passing book, a few of which everyone figured forever enshrined in the name of former Duck quarterback Dan Fouts. He set 13 new
