charges and was capable of communicating

Kent also called OSU Police Sgt. Edwin Eugene Hunter and U.S. Treasury agent Jerry Tate as witnesses in the pre-trial hearing. Hunter was an original investigator in the case. Tate works for the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms and filed an affidavit in the case.

Hunter linked Buker to the attempted bombing with testimony including existence of matching fingerprints, voice identification and different

writing samples with the same word misspelled.

Hunter also testified about a relationship between Buker and Myers' wife, Donna, which appeared to be connected with the attempted bombing. Tate's affidavit quotes a witness as saying Buker admitted being in love with Donna Myers. Hunter described Donna Myers as "the mothering type and Buker needed to be cared for." Donna Myers reportedly told the Corvallis Gazette-Times she was trying to prevent Buker from committing suicide.

Hunter said telephone com-

pany records logged 587 phone calls from Buker's phone to the Myers' residence during the last six months of 1986, and 97 calls from the Myers' phone to Buker's residence during that same period. In mid-December 1986, William Myers asked the caller to stop bothering his home, Hunter said.

Hunter also testified about several reports made to officials by William Myers before the attempted bombing. During one incident, Myers reported a personal assault from which he suffered a fractured skull.

## Laurels

The University's School of Architecture and Allied Arts has announced the recipients of separate awards given in recognition of graduates with exceptional potential in architecture and in sculpture.

**Paul Olson**, an architect with Thallon and Edrington Architects of Eugene, plans to use the \$5,000 Ion Lewis Traveling Scholarship to travel to Europe. There he will study the architecture of Aldo Van Eyck, Herman Hertzberger and others who inspired him.

The purpose of the scholarship, established in 1930 through a bequest from Portland architect Ion Lewis, is to advance the profession of architecture in Oregon, according to Wilmot Gilland, dean of the School of Architecture and Allied Arts. Recipients are practicing architects who have graduated from the University architecture department.

**Tom Walsh**, who earned his master of fine arts degree in

sculpture in June, is the first recipient of the Jan Zach Award. The \$500 award is given by the University fine arts department to an outstanding graduate student in sculpture, in memory of the late University professor whose own sculptures were internationally acclaimed. It was established with a gift fund following Zach's death in September of 1986.

**Kathleen Brennan** of Yoncalla has been chosen recipient of the first Richard C. Babb Internship at McDonald, Babb and Clarkson, Inc. advertising agency of Portland and Boise.

Brennan was one of eight finalists from the University of Oregon, Oregon State University, Portland State University, and the University of Washington. She will be a senior at the University this fall.

The \$1,000 internship was established in memory of Richard C. Babb, chairman of the agency from 1982 until his death last November. The Babb

Internship will be awarded annually.

Brennan will spend most of the summer at McDonald, Babb and Clarkson's Portland headquarters, gaining practical experience in the field of advertising.
