Missiles may be out

MOSCOW (AP) — Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev said the Kremlin is ready to eliminate its medium- and shorter-range missiles in Asia if the United States does not station 100 mid-range warheads in Alaska, the Soviet news agency Tass said Wednesday.

Tass reported the Soviet leader made the remarks in written replies to questions from the Indonesian newspaper Merdeka.

One of the potential obstacles in the deadlocked arms reduction talks has been U.S. insistence on the right to deploy 100 warheads with a 600-to-1,500-mile range in Alaska, across the Bering Strait from the Soviet Union.

U.S. flag flies in gulf

DUBAI, United Arab Emirates (AP) — Two Kuwaiti tankers sailed swiftly up the Persian Gulf on Wednesday, escorted by U.S. jet fighters and Navy warships on high alert for Iran's high-speed gunboats and helicopters.

Iran has vowed to strike the convoy, take American sailors prisoner and burn the flags flying on the fantails of the reflagged Kuwaiti tankers if any of its ships are attacked.

The supertanker Bridgeton and the smaller oil products carrier Gas Prince were surrounded by three and, at times, five U.S. warships as they passed within range of an Iranian missile battery in the Strait of Hormuz, considered the most perilous part of their three-day, 500-mile journey to Kuwait.

Diana honored

LONDON (AP) — Princess Diana of Wales became a Freeman of the City of London on Wednesday, giving her the right to drive sheep across the London Bridge.

Diana, 26, received the title at the Guildhall, the historic seat of London's civic government, in a ceremony dating from 1275.

Nowadays the title is honorary, but Diana recalled that it still carries the right of sheepdriving.

"I promise I will give good warning before I avail myself of this privilege," she said.

Inflation rates on rise

WASHINGTON (AP) — Consumer prices, still rebounding from last year's fall in energy costs, rose at an annual rate of 5.4 percent for the first half of 1987, the steepest six-month inflation rate in five years, the government said Wednesday.

The Labor Department reported a moderate 0.4 percent gain in its Consumer Price Index for June, up from a 0.3 percent advance in May and matching the increases of February, March and April. Prices were up 0.7 percent in January.

The June index, equivalent to an annual rate of 4.3 percent, was paced by higher energy and food costs. Although below the six-month average, it still underscored the higher inflation levels that have been present all this year.

Contras up attacks

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S.-backed Contra rebels have been averaging three attacks a day on Nicaragua's transportation network recently as part of a sizable expansion in their war on the leftist Sandinista government, an American military official said Wednesday.

Since \$100 million in U.S. assistance to the Contras began flowing last fall, there have been increasing signs of demoralization of the Sandinista Army, reflected in a desertion rate of 10 to 15 per-

cent, the official said.

The official provided the account to a group of reporters at the State Department on condition of anonymity.

The briefing was one in a series the Reagan Administration is planning as part of its effort to secure congressional approval of additional aid to the Contras when the current allocation expires on Sept. 30.

Oregonian extradited

ELKHART, Ind. (AP) — A former Oregon religious leader charged in the alleged abuse of commune members near Salem was ordered Wednesday to return to face the charges.

Ariel Ben Sherman, 58, will be returned within days, Salem Det. Sgt. Larry Stevens said at the extradition hearing.

Sherman had refused to waive his right to challenge extradition after his arrest last May in Elkhart. In January 1985, Sherman was indicted on three felony charges of criminal mistreatment and two misdemeanor assault counts, Oregon authorities said.

State authorities raided Sherman's Good Shepherd Tabernacle in 1984 after a teenage member arrested for shoplifting complained of excessive disciplinary measures.

Court-martial begins

QUANTICO, Va. (AP) — The sex-for-secrets court-martial of former Moscow Embassy guard Clayton Lonetree, 25, opened Wednesday with the Marine sergeant's lawyers asking about possible prejudice against their client.

"I think the question of him being an American Indian is a very important one," said William Kunstler, who is heading the defense.

He faces 13 counts, including espionage, involving alleged disclosure of classified embassy information such as floor plans and office assignments.

Kunstler said the information involved was "pure junk, like telephone books" and should not be classified. He also said prosecutors "want to make a mountain out of a molehill" of Lonetree's love affair with a Soviet woman.

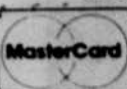
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
