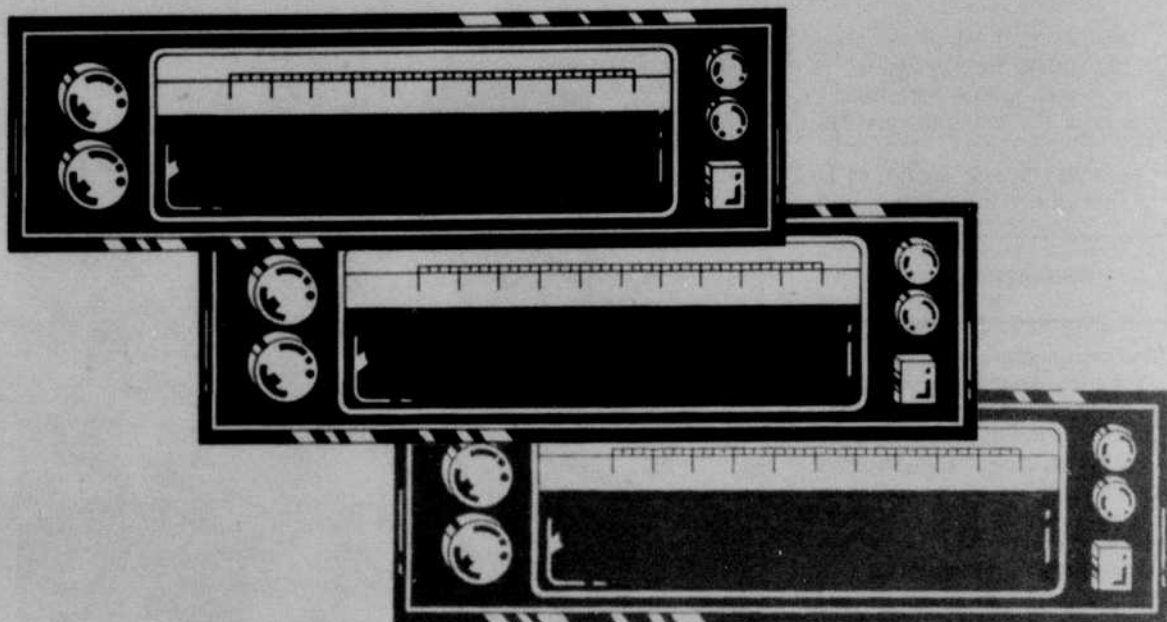

MUSIC

Airwaves propagate entertainment



Welcome to the airwaves of Eugene. For those of us too poor or lazy to invest in a stereo and album collection, local radio stations provide our only means of regular musical enjoyment.

The FM band contains 10 stations, the AM seven. The variety rivals anything found in the big city, with classical and jazz, all the way to punk rock and heavy metal; a heavy dose of mainstream pop rock floats in between.

• KLCC 89.7 airs a format of jazz, folk music and new age electronic music. "It's different from sign on to sign off," said Michael Canning, operations director. The "LCC" stands for Lane Community College, its sponsor. Some of the many shows include "Ahora Si" a Spanish language music and talk show, "Tropical Beat" with Afropop and Caribbean music and the "New Dreamers" electronic music show. Another added feature is the no-nonsense and critically acclaimed National Public Radio's Morning Edition news.

• KWAX 91.1 distinguishes itself as one of only two 24-hour classical music stations in

Oregon. The format carries modern and traditional renditions of classical scores in addition to opera. The University owned and operated station broadcasts out of Villard Hall on campus. The station broadcasts regular BBC newscasts, the MacNeil/Leher News Hour, and Business Update.

• KRVM 91.9 offers the most eclectic programming in Eugene, bar none. The weekday format includes jazz, new wave, swing, and blues in schizophrenic succession. The station's goal is "to serve all unserved audiences," according to Program Director John Etheredge. Classical and mainstream pop are the only sounds left out. Saturday morning opens with "Jiven John's Country Classics." Sunday nights end with the "Modern Mono" hardcore punk rock show.

• KSND 93.1 devotes itself to the pop rock spectrum. "What we play is based on what sells best in Eugene and Springfield," said David Shakes, program director. Special shows include Wednesday night's "Rock Over London," "Hitline USA," and the "Rick Dees American Music Magazine" on early weekday mornings.

• KMGE 94.5 falls into the category of "adult contemporary."

Eugene has three FM and two AM stations
