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On a warm, dawg-day afternoon...

Ducks send Huskies whimpering home, 29-22

Amid the pandemonium of the Oregon locker room following the Ducks' 29-22 upset Pacific-10 Conference victory over Washington Saturday, strong tackle Jeff Stefanick sat in a sea of tranquility.

Stefanick occupies the locker next to quarterback Bill Musgrave, but Musgrave had made a quick dash for the shower and Stefanick was sitting alone, shaking his head and talking to no one in particular.

"This was the biggest game of my life. Being from Seattle, a senior, a team captain. To beat the Huskies is my wildest fantasy, and we did it," he said quietly.

The game had special meaning to Stefanick, but the magnitude of the victory was felt equally by all the players, coaches, and the Autzen Stadium-record 44,421 fans in attendance.

It was the first Oregon win over the Huskies in six years. It was the first time the Ducks had beaten Washington at Autzen Stadium since 1973. It had Oregon coach Rich Brooks, who has his team off to a 3-1 start, (1-0 in the Pacific-10 Conference), talking seriously about a national ranking.

"I don't know where we stand with the top teams in the country, but we are in that category," Brooks said, citing his team's victories over three 1986 bowl-game participants and a narrow 24-14 loss to eighth-ranked Ohio State that was closer than the score indicated.

This game was not as close as the scoreboard showed, but Washington refused to give in after tailback Russell Lawson

gathered in Musgrave's pass in the flat and rambled 31 yards to cap a 22-point spree and stake the Ducks to a 29-14 advantage, less than one minute into the fourth quarter.

Husky quarterback Chris Chandler may not be a Heisman Trophy candidate after all, but he took charge and guided the Dawgs 70 yards in 10 plays, hitting flanker Brian Slater from seven yards out to narrow the gap to 29-20 with 1:43 remaining.

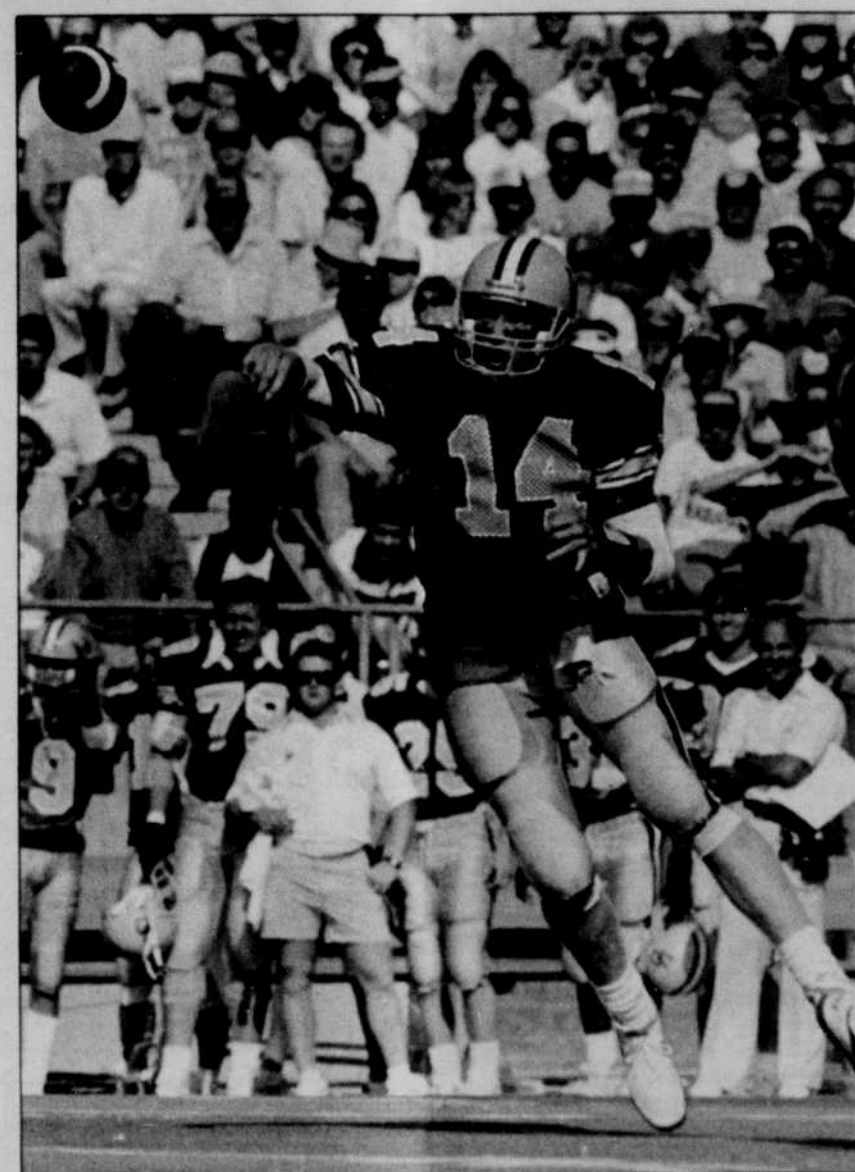
The two-point conversion attempt failed, but Washington covered the ensuing onside kick, and when Chandler hit split end Darryl Franklin for 17 yards to the Oregon 41, it put the fans back on the edge of their seats.

Chandler, pressured out of the pocket by noseguard Rollin Putzier and defensive end Matt Brock, aimed his next toss for the end zone. But Duck cornerback Brett Young, who also recovered a fumble and made four solo tackles on the afternoon, leaped high to pluck the ball out of the air at the Oregon one-yard line.

The officials ruled that Young had come down at the one before falling into the end zone, and the Ducks still had their backs to the wall. When Washington defensive end Bob Willig crashed through on third down to wrap up Lawson for a safety, it set the stage for the game's nerve-racking conclusion.

Kirk Dennis, who was perfect on three field goal attempts, including a 53-yarder, free-kicked from the Oregon 20-yard line, and Washington's Andre Riley returned the ball 29 yards to the Oregon 46, giving Chandler good field position and 46 ticks on the clock to work with.

Chandler, who wound up hitting only 20 of 48 attempts for 318 yards and two touchdowns, went

almost exclusively to Slater in the final drive, connecting one time for 19 yards to move the ball down to the Webfoot 27.

After an illegal procedure penalty pushed it back to the 32, Chandler went looking for Slater twice more.

Cornerback Ron Gould had been burned badly by Slater on the Huskies first touchdown, but he came back to bat away one pass and then, with just five seconds to play, picked off Chandler's last desperate heave into the end zone to secure the win.

"We were in a three-deep zone. I was reading the quarterback the whole way and I just went to the ball," Gould recalled.

The game began as if it would follow traditional Duck-Husky form. Washington took the opening kickoff and marched 92 yards in 12 plays, including 35 yards on the ground.

When Slater's inside fake turned Gould around completely ("a rookie mistake," Gould admitted later) and Chandler connected for the 36-yard touchdown, things looked a little bleak.

"They came out with a lot of intensity, and they may have had trouble keeping it up," Brooks said after the game.

The two teams then exchanged punts as the Ducks' first two drives produced just 11 yards. But fans got the first clue that this game might be a little bit different on Oregon's third offensive possession.

Standing at his own 17-yard line, Musgrave saw Washington cornerback Art Malone leaning inside. "We thought we could get him to bite on play action, and he took it," Musgrave recalled.

The redshirt-freshman signal-caller faked to tailback Derek Loville, then rolled right. Split end Terry Obee got behind Malone at midfield, gathered in Musgrave's throw in stride at the Husky 40, and sailed untouched into the end zone.

The 83-yard touchdown pass

was the fifth-longest in Oregon history, leading Brooks to say, "I think (Musgrave) dispelled the rumor that he can't throw deep."

Musgrave has made a habit of dispelling rumors, and is well on his way to building a legend. He completed 16 of 23 attempts for 282 yards and two touchdowns, and almost certainly improved on his fifth-place national passing efficiency ranking.

In four games, Musgrave has thrown just one interception. After the game, Washington coach Don James said, "He is the best quarterback we've faced, and he may be the best in the conference."

Chandler regrouped his charges after Oregon's first TD, and drove them 80 yards before scoring himself on a one-yard keeper. The momentum shifted for good, however, after the Ducks' next possession.

Facing a second-and-ten from the Washington 47-yard line, Musgrave rolled out looking for tight end Tim Parker. The pass was tipped by a Husky defender, bounced off Parker's back and fell right into Loville's arms.

The sophomore tailback turned up the sideline and went 31 yards before being forced out of bounds at the Washington 16. A roughing-the-passer penalty moved it half the distance to the goal, and instead of an incomplete pass and third down, it was first-and-goal from the eight. Loville bounced it in off left tackle from a yard out three plays later. "Things were going our way," Loville recalled.

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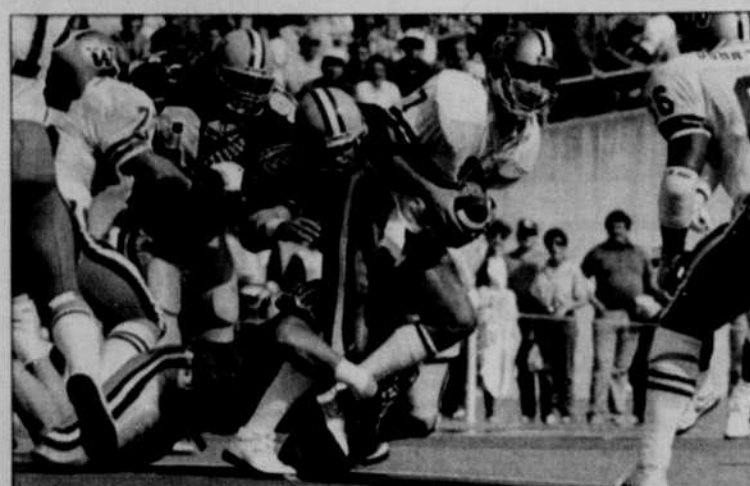
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Husky QB Chris Chandler goes down under the wraps of DE Devin Fitzpatrick, with LB Scott Kozak moving in.
