Washington tour places Oregon two games closer to '84 record

The University will take all the credit, thank you, for the University of Washington's "lost weekend."
Before the Ducks' football squad beat up on the Huskies Saturday, the Oregon

volleyballers outlasted the Washington volleyball team Friday night in Seattle, 9-15, 15-6, 15-12, 16-18, and 15-11.
The Ducks' five-game win was followed by an easy three-game victory over Washington State on Saturday, 15-13, 15-5, 15-9, in front of a sparse crowd of 230 in Pullman.

Middle blocker Lauri Krejcha, seventh in the nation in blocks per game (1.8), was consistent enough with 10 blocks. Offensively, Michele Krebsbach led all players with 26 kills, while Teri Kramer and Melissa Terzian added 20 each. Stephanie Snyder collected a season-high 73 assists.

"Kramer and Terzian were our most steady players against Washington. They both played good, all-around volleyball," Gregory said.

He added, "Our serving was poor but our passing was very good. We made some silly mistakes in game four when we had the chance to win. We fell behind in that game, came back and finally led, 16-15, when we had some costly service errors."

The Ducks' match with Washington State on Saturday was merely a scrimmage for Oregon.

The only scare of the evening was the Cougars' 13-11 lead in game one, won by the Ducks after Oregon came back to score the final four points of the game.

"We didn't perform that well in game one but we picked up the intensity and maintained it in games two and three," Gregory said.

Oregon jumped out to a 13-3 lead in the second game, and reeled off seven of the last eight points in game three to win the match.

Terzian led the Ducks with 13 kills and a .242 hitting percentage. Kramer and Krejcha added seven kills each. Tina Adolph and Snyder collected 13 and 18 assists respectively.

Defensively, Oregon tamed the Cougars, holding Washington State to a .061 hitting percentage.

Though the Ducks never received much competition from the Cougars (1-4 in the Pac-10), Gregory was pleased with his teams' ninth straight win, and said the fine play is paying off.

"Melissa Terzian played real well for us and Tina Adolph did a nice job as the setter in game three," he said. "It's exciting to see us play so well. We've been working real hard."
