Men and women Frisbee teams look for recruits in new season

Rebecca Watkins, Oregon women's Ultimate Frisbee coordinator, describes the game as "the ultimate in action."

A non-contact, fast-paced sport, ultimate Frisbee combines the kickoff and scoring of football, the running and positioning of soccer, and the passing and defending of basketball.

A "pull," much like a football kickoff, begins the game. The seven players on the team line up in the end zones where the disc is thrown to the opposing team and the excitement starts. The Frisbee is passed down the field and then the receiver must stop, establish a pivot foot, and complete the pass. An interception or incomplete pass results in a turnover.

Scoring is made by a completed pass into the end zone and is worth one point. A typical game is played to fifteen points. There are only substitutions between points. The length of the game depends on skill level and weather conditions.

"Nothing stops us!" said John McGloghlin, who is co-coordinator with D. C. Boots of the men's ultimate team. McGloghlin has played in all types of weather, including snow when he played on the East Coast in high school.

The action never stops because in ultimate there are no designated officials or referees. To most Frisbee players, "The Spirit of the Game," the sport's rule book, is the main appeal. Members pride themselves on fair-play.

Art Peck, a new team member from New Jersey, said "Ultimate Frisbee is a model for society." The system of trust among players makes Ultimate Frisbee the unique sport it is.

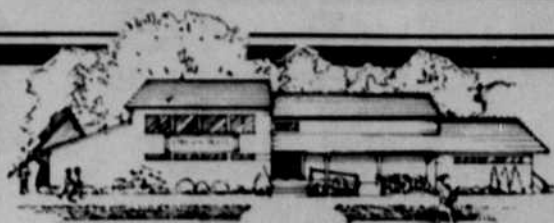
The founder of Oregon's Ultimate Frisbee program, Henry Callahan, initiated the sport on campus in the late 1970's. "He was a prime example of a player who displays the spirit of the game," said Rebecca Watkins. The present ultimate team maintains its spirit and hosts the annual "Henry Callahan Memorial Mud Bowl" in March, which opens the spring collegiate competitive season.

Oregon competes in the Western Region of the National Ultimate Frisbee Collegiate Association, which includes teams from Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana, and northern California. The best three teams who qualify at the regionals proceed to the National Competition. All the women's teams that qualify for regionals have the opportunity to go to nationals because of the fewer women players.

In only four years of intercollegiate competition the Oregon men's team has been nationally acclaimed. In 1986, the team won the regional championships and ranked fifth in the nation after competing at the national championships in St. Louis.

The men were also nationally recognized by other ultimate Frisbee teams for displaying the best "spirit of the game" attitude. Last spring the San Luis Obispo team edged out the Oregon men's team at the regional championships in Palo Alto, Calif. The team missed going to the na-
