Politics are hard to seriously explore on film; there hasn't been an American film in recent history able to do it.

Sayles does slip for a few moments in "Matewan," particularly in a twist right out of Greek drama (and the Bible, as you'll see if you catch the film) that doesn't fit next to the loose feel of the complete film, and he can never quite overcome the demand for an individual hero rather than a collective hero.

Sayles makes up for it in his serious portrayal of the issues and his celebration of collective action. The finest moments show the community coming together and the barriers of race and nationality breaking down. Sayles imbues these scenes with such conviction and belief that they charge the film with energy and love.

"Matewan" may not carry the more challenging tone of "Salt of the Earth" but there is nothing he should be ashamed of.

"Matewan" will be seen by many more people and the celebration of collective grassroots action is a healthy theme to be explored in times like these.
