## Netters lose Pac-10 lead with two home losses

They knew it wouldn't last forever. After going for more than a month without a loss, the Oregon volleyball team's nine-match win streak came to a screeching halt this weekend with home losses to both California (12-15, 13-15, 15-4, 15-3, 8-15) and Stanford (8-15, 17-19, 11-15).

With the two losses, the Ducks (9-5 overall, 6-2 in the Pacific-10 Conference) fall out of the Pac-10 lead and are now a half-game behind 6-1 Stanford, and tied with UCLA (5-1) for second.

Against California (3-3) on Friday, the Ducks jumped out to a big lead in game one, and although it was early in the match, Oregon appeared to be on its way to a club record-tying 10th straight win.

With the Ducks' Teri Kramer serving, the Ducks jumped out to a 10-1 advantage after a hit by Cal's Diana Yovino-Young landed out. Oregon's Stephanie Drier and Eva Windlin stuffed another Bears' shot. Young committed an attack error, and Kramer scored a service ace.

California slowly crept back into the game, and with the score 12-7 Oregon, the Bears reeled off seven straight points behind the jump-serving of Holly McPeak.

McPeak, a freshman listed by Volleyball Monthly as "the most coveted setter in America" last year, tied the Ducks up all night with her line drive serves.

The second game was a close battle with the score being tied seven times before Cal's Lisa Arce blocked an Oregon hit for the win and a 2-0 match advantage for the Bears.

The Ducks would not give in easily, however. In fact, Oregon came back to overpower Cal in game three, getting two kills each from Melissa Terzian, Lauri Krejcha, and Kramer.

Krejcha played strong at the net all night long, collecting 11 kills, three block solos and seven block assists. Kramer finished with 23 kills and a .292

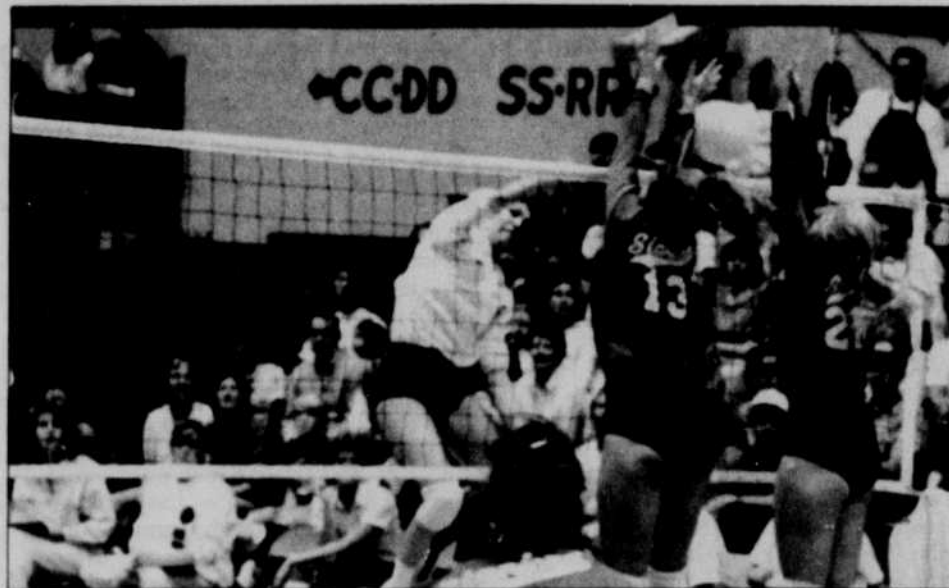

hitting percentage.

After their 11-point win in the third game, Oregon picked up where they left off in game four, scoring the first five points behind the serving of Monica Camp and Terzian.

The Ducks ran off the final eight points for the win to even the match at two games apiece.

Oregon obviously had the momentum going into the fifth and deciding game, but Cal had other ideas.

The Ducks opened up a 5-3 lead early, but the Bears came roaring back with strong serving from McPeak and Arce's

drop-serves, which Oregon coach Gerry Gregory said "caught us out of position a few times."

Cal's 11 unanswered points and 14-6 lead were too much for Oregon to overcome, and the Bears had their first win against the Ducks since 1983.

Oregon was no match for 4th-ranked Stanford on Saturday before a record volleyball match crowd of 2,474 at McArthur Court.

The Cardinal showed their strength in game one, flying out to a 9-3 lead after

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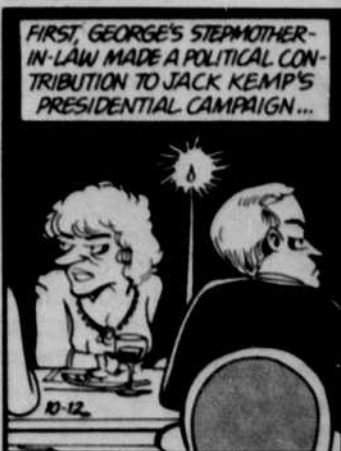
