Ducks humble favored Trojans, tuck away yet another big win

The Oregon football team has tried wearing the mantle of success, and decided it likes the fit.

Previous Webfoot teams have found it to be a heavy burden, and buckled under its weight. But, as Ducks offensive coordinator Bob Toledo pointed out after the Ducks outplayed then outlasted USC 34-27 Saturday at Autzen Stadium, this team is either too young to know past history, or too confident to acknowledge it.

The upstart Ducks outplayed USC in every facet of the game, and humbled the Trojans for three full quarters before withstanding yet another last-minute rally. The win improved Oregon's record to 4-1 overall, and 2-0 — good for a share of the lead — in the Pacific-10 Conference.

It also convinced a lot of people everywhere that the Ducks are for real. Oregon has now won seven of its last eight, dating back to last season, and this is the first time since 1971 the Ducks have beaten USC and Washington in the same season.

The next hurdle to overcome is 11th-ranked UCLA next week. The Bruins, who had this week off, are also 4-1, and 2-0 in the Pac-10. They will be heavily favored, at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, next Saturday.

That will, of course, be nothing new. The Ducks were neck-and-neck with USC in most national polls last week, but entered Saturday's contest 7½ point underdogs despite playing at home, where they had won two straight.

It marked the fourth time in five games Oregon has been picked to lose big, and each time they have covered the spread, winning three.

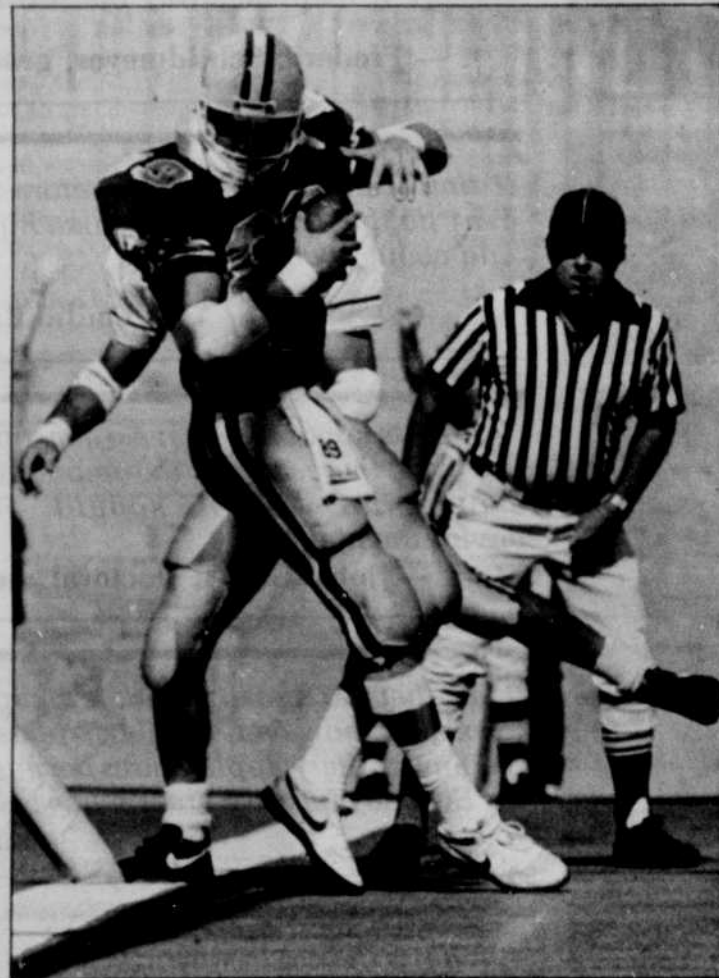

By the time Trojan quarterback Rodney Peete got untracked in the fourth quarter, Oregon had established an insurmountable 20-point cushion behind Bill Musgrave's worst game — which was still pretty spectacular — and a fired up defense that was completely spectacular.

"They didn't know what direction we were coming from on either side of the ball," coach Rich Brooks said.

Defensive coordinator Denny Shuler said he didn't do anything fancy to prepare his crew for the Trojans, who entered the game leading the Pac-10 in total offense, or

Peete, who engineered seven scoring marches of 63 yards or better in last week's 48-14 thrashing of Oregon State.

Relying mainly on the "base" 3-4 alignment, the Ducks stuffed the Trojans offense completely in the first half. USC came into the contest converting 57 percent of their third-down conversions, but they were just 4 of 13 against the Ducks. "We couldn't do anything on second down," USC coach Larry Smith said.
