

## Ducks Continued from Page 8

played catch above the overpursuing Southern Cal linebackers, and senior J.J. Birden provided an acrobatic 35-yard reception as the Ducks roared to a 21-0 halftime lead over the shellshocked Trojans.

The 39,587 fans in attendance were beside themselves. At the end of the half they stood and gave the Ducks an ovation the likes of which hasn't been heard since... last week. The two-game total of 84,008 set a new consecutive game attendance record at the 20-year old facility.

For the record, Oregon limited the Trojans to 126 yards of total offense in the first half, but 58 of those came on the Trojans first two plays.

Tailback Derek Loville shook off his toe injury to gain 48 first-half rushing yards. The Ducks outgained USC 91-56 on the ground at the half, on their way to a season-high 161 for the game. Loville led all rushers with 91 yards on 24 carries, while fullback Latin Berry added 39 on nine.

Musgrave led the Ducks to 305 yards of total offense after 30 minutes, including 214 through the air, but the three touchdown advantage could have been even greater.

Three drives reached Trojan territory only to be killed by Musgrave miscues as he, for the first time, showed traces of his inexperience.

"Billy the Kid" committed four turnovers against the hard-hitting Trojans, lost in two fumbles and suffering a pair

of interceptions.

By the way, he also completed 22 of 33 passes for 287 yards and three TDs, all career highs. His 22 completions found 10 different receivers. "That's the great thing about a multiple offense; if they take away a couple things you still have the ammunition to try something else," Toledo said.

Fans got their first hint that USC was taking Oregon seriously early on. Trailing 14-0 with 5:45 remaining in the first quarter, USC inexplicably quick-kicked on third down from their own 12-yard line. Peete's punt traveled only 32 yards before it was downed at the SC 44.

"We were worried about kicking into the wind, and about (Duck punt returner Terry) Obee getting a long return," Smith explained after the game, adding: "We thought we could get a good bounce, but the bounces went against us all day."

An 11-yard screen play and a pass interference penalty pushed the ball down to the 14. On third-and-nine from the 13, Musgrave was hit from behind, fumbled, and USC's Dan Owens fell on it at the 10 to squelch the threat.

The 19-year-old freshman shortly thereafter made the first bad throwing decision of his young career, tossing into double coverage on third-and-10 with time winding down in the first half.

Cornerback Dwayne Garner picked off the gift and brought it back to the Web-foot 43. That set the stage for this week's version of The Stand. It is becoming a

trademark of the Duck defense.

A Peete scramble of 13 yards, and a personal foul tacked on after the gain, pushed the line of scrimmage down to the Webfoot 29. Fullback Leroy Holt was stuffed by Matt Brock after a two-yard gain, two Peete passes fell incomplete, and Erik Affholter's 44-yard field goal attempt went wide to the right.

Oregon promptly marched back into Trojan territory, but another Musgrave fumble with 11 seconds left gave the defense one last opportunity to preserve the first-half shutout. Cornerback Ron Gould's interception from center field did the trick. "That was as good a half as I've been around," Shuler said.

The Ducks now have produced nine

shutout quarters in five games. A year ago, they managed just eight for the entire season.

The final nail in the Trojan coffin came on Obee's tightrope act three plays into the last quarter. USC mounted its best drive of the day after Dennis' second field goal gave Oregon a 27-7 with 2:50 remaining in the third, moving 79 yards in just five plays to close within 13.

Toledo had an answer for that. Three rushing plays. Three first downs. The Ducks ate ground in big chunks to close out the period and set the stage for Obee.

The sophomore got behind coverage in the end zone, reached high to pluck Musgrave's soft 18-yard aerial out of the air and kept his feet inbounds.

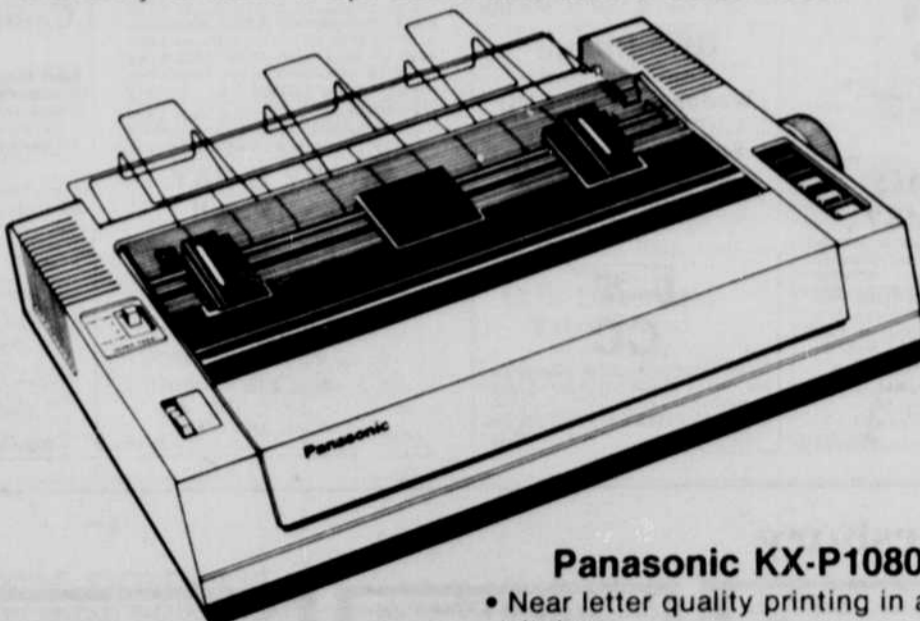
