Ducks receive ranking in national polls

The Oregon football team, riding the crest of a three-game winning streak, vaulted into a national wire-service poll for the first time in 17 years, the Athletic Department reported Monday.

Oregon (4-1 overall, 2-0 in Pacific-10 Conference play)

checked in at number 18 in the United Press International coaches poll released Monday.

It marks the first time since 1970 that the Ducks have been included on a national wire-service poll. That year, the UPI ranked Oregon 26th in the country for one week after it

beat then-top-ranked USC and Air Force back-to-back.

Coach Rich Brooks' young gridders also improved on their rankings in two national publications' polls from a week ago. The Ducks 34-27 victory over USC on Oct. 10 convinced the Sporting News to move Oregon from the 19th to the 15th spot in its poll, while USA Today/CNN moved the Ducks up seven places, from 23rd last week to 16th Monday.

The Associated Press poll will be released later today, and Oregon's position on that top-20 list was not available, but the AP did confirm that Oregon will be ranked. The Ducks were 22nd in last week's AP poll.

Two members of the Webfoot football team remained among the nation's leaders in statistics also released Monday.

Quarterback Bill Musgrave slipped two notches from second to fourth in passing efficiency, but improved to 10th nationally in total offense, up from 16th last week. Through five games, Musgrave has completed 65% of his passes for 1,170 yards and 11 touchdowns.

Return specialist Terry Obee improved to fourth in the country in punt return yardage by bringing back three for 67 yards against USC. His average of 19.3 per return is two yards higher than the current Oregon record.
