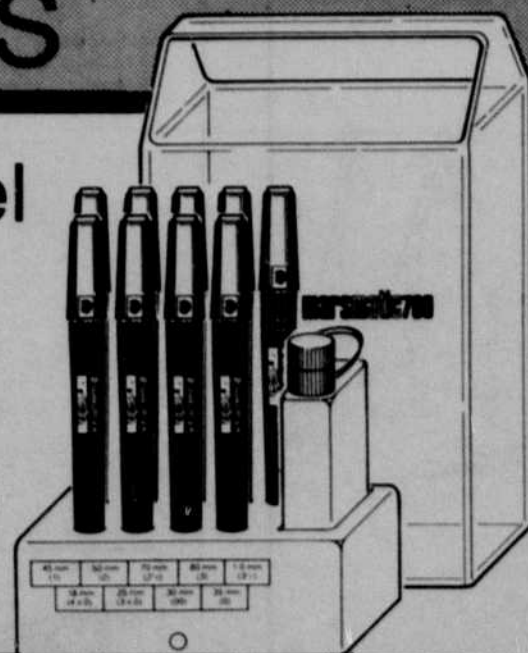

timber may be destroyed by the blaze before it is contained.

Earlier this month, an Oregon Legislature panel agreed to reserve \$15 million of the state's emergency fund to cover the firefighting costs, and the U.S. Senate approved a \$10-billion appropriation to pay for firefighting damages in the Pacific Northwest and various land purchases.

All totaled, 8,992 men and women combatted the fires in the west this summer, including 1,054 provided by the National Guard and 650 members of the U.S. Army deployed to fight the blazes. About 1,000 are still on duty. The efforts to combat all of the western fires are considered the largest deployment of firefighters in U.S. history.
